**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 5203**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the
2 line and delete line 3 and insert “creating new provisions; amending sections
3 3, 6, 7, 8, 10, 13, 13a and 16, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019; and declaring
4 an emergency.”.

5 Delete lines 5 through 20 and insert:

6 **“SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
7 read:

8 **“Sec. 3.** The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning
9 July 1, 2019, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund,
10 to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the following purposes:

2 **“SECTION 2.** Section 6, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
3 read:

4 **“Sec. 6.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from
5 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the
6 Governor, the amount of [\$3,932,736] **\$4,106,514** for expenses of the Regional
7 Solutions Program.

8 **“SECTION 3.** Section 7, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
9 read:

10 **“Sec. 7.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall es-
11 tablish a process for allocating available moneys in the Administrative Ser-
12 vices Economic Development Fund on a quarterly basis to fulfill the biennial
13 allocations made by sections 1 to 12a of this 2019 Act. The department shall
14 set the quarterly allocations.

15 **“(2)** If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery
16 Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund are insuf-
17 ficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 12a of this
18 2019 Act or any other 2019 Act, prior to making any other allocations pur-
19 suant to sections 1 to 12a of this 2019 Act, the department shall satisfy lot-
20 tery bond debt service obligations in the amount of [\$263,661,510]
21 **\$260,972,723** for outstanding lottery bonds.

22 **“(3)** After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection
23 (2) of this section are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the
24 State Lottery Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development
25 Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections
26 1 to 12a of this 2019 Act, the department shall reduce the quarterly allo-
27 cations not described in subsection (2) of this section proportionately in
28 amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

29 **“SECTION 4.** Section 8, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
30 read:

1 “**Sec. 8.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from
2 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon
3 Department of Administrative Services, the amount of [~~\$263,661,510~~]
4 **\$260,972,723** for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and
5 premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section 7 of
6 this 2019 Act.

7 “**SECTION 5.** Section 10, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
8 read:

9 “**Sec. 10.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549
10 (2) for a percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning
11 July 1, 2019, the amount allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-
12 nomic Development Fund to the Problem Gambling Treatment Fund is
13 [~~\$14,593,071~~] **\$14,687,792.**

14 “**SECTION 6.** Section 13, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to
15 read:

16 “**Sec. 13.** There are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
17 from the Veterans’ Services Fund, to the Veterans’ Department of Veterans’
18 Affairs Dedicated Lottery Fund, the following amounts for the following
19 purposes:

29 “**Sec. 13a.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
30 from the Veterans’ Services Fund, to the Bureau of Labor and Industries, the

1 amount of [~~\$250,000~~] **\$260,230** for the purpose of implementing the provisions
2 of [*section 1, chapter 528, Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled House Bill 2202)*] **ORS**
3 **660.220**.

4 **“SECTION 8. There is allocated for the biennium ending June 30,**
5 **2021, from the Veterans’ Services Fund established under ORS 406.140,**
6 **to the Long Term Care Ombudsman, the amount of \$391,302 for the**
7 **Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator to provide public guardian**
8 **and conservator services exclusively to veterans.**

9 **“SECTION 9. Notwithstanding section 44, chapter 355, Oregon Laws**
10 **2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, the amount transferred**
11 **by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from the Ad-**
12 **ministrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Employer**
13 **Incentive Fund pursuant to section 44, chapter 355, Oregon Laws 2019,**
14 **may not exceed \$5,405,177.**

15 **“SECTION 10. Section 16, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to**
16 **read:**

17 **“Sec. 16. There are allocated to the Department of Public Safety Stan-**
18 **dards and Training for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Crim-**
19 **inal Fine Account, the following amounts for the following purposes:**

- 20 (1) Criminal justice training
21 [*and standards operations..... \$ 31,999,031*]
22 **and standards operations..... \$ 34,699,952**
23 (2) Public Safety Memorial Fund \$ 279,495

24 **“SECTION 11. This 2020 Act being necessary for the immediate**
25 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
26 **declared to exist, and this 2020 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
