Overview

- HECC to convene workgroup to study and develop recommendations related to:
 - Coordinated, statewide approach to best serve adults in custody who are recently eligible to receive student grants under a federal grant.
- Workgroup to report regarding results and recommendations of the study to legislature in December.

1965

Congress Enacts Title IV of Higher Education Act (HEA)

1992

HEA Amended to Prohibit AICs Serving Life & Death Sentences

1994

Violent Crimes & Law Enforcement Act Passed

2015

• Experimental Sites Initiative – Second Chance Pell Program Created

2020

Expansion Early in Year & Ban Lifted later in Year

2023

• Full implementation of 2020 Legislative Change



SB 234: Guiding Goals and Report Framing

Goal/Purpose:

 Make 2nd Chance Pell an effective educational resource for AICs by establishing marketdriven state-wide programs of study that can be delivered in person, remotely, and online by all postsecondary institutions and at all Corrections facilities, universally transferable between facilities and institutions so that educational progress (SAP) and program completion is universally achievable

Curriculum and Course Delivery

- Offer and provide a variety of educational program delivery modalities
- Build upon the work of the Transfer Council
- Partnerships: Colleges, Universities, DOC, HECC, and more
- Increased priorities for expanded access to educational opportunities



Technology

Develop and upgrade infrastructure at DOC facilities to support internet access

Allow online completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), including email account access for students

Allow for synchronous video instruction at multiple facilities



Policy and Practice

Amend Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 421.081

Revise Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR), Chapter 291, Division 77

DOC transparency in the selection of programs and providers

Allow full time education to qualify as work under Measure 17

AICs in Pell eligible programs enrollment considerations

AICs who are enrolled in Pell eligible certificate or degree programs should be allowed to enroll in at least 6 and up to 12 credits per term, in order to maximize Pell awards

Policy and Practice

Allow AICs who are engaged in Pell Eligible Programs to be considered for hold in a particular facility, or for transfer to participating facilities, when necessary to continue their education.

DOC to provide appropriate classroom space for education at each facility

Provide *Navigator* positions at each correctional institution to work directly with students to assist with advising, coordination, and FASFA applications.

Provide Post-secondary Coordinator positions at each institution.

Educational resources and materials made available to students.

Expand the Adult Basic Skills (ABS) Tutoring Program to include Postsecondary Tutor Programs
