I am the Student Inclusion and Success Coordinator for the OHSU School of Nursing, La Grande Campus. As Student Inclusion and Success Coordinator, I support our undergraduate nursing students by providing resources for emotional, academic, and financial support. While my role is to support all students on our campus, I spent the past four years as part of a federal grant with a focus and emphasis on supporting underrepresented nursing students and recruiting underrepresented students interested in the nursing field. The grant concluded June 2021.

Over the past four years, I have witnessed the profound impact of funding support by initiatives such as that of the Task Force on Student Success for Underrepresented Students in Higher Education. The cost of higher education can be a burden to many students, despite scholarship resources and financial aid. This financial burden can make it difficult for students to be academically successful. In addition to the typical challenges a student may face in higher education, students from underrepresented backgrounds often face other obstacles as a result of pursing a career where they are the minority.
