 - Recommendation: Interagency Council on Homelessness






- Shelter and safety services for DVSA survivors (\$10M ODSVS)
- Behavioral Health Housing (\$100M OHA)
- Local Government Response (\$25M Direct to cities and counties)
- Trash/Sanitation Services (\$13M Direct to Metro and cities)
- Homeless Prevention and Response Efforts (\$80M OHCS)
