HB 2612

(4:05 PM) Directs State Department of Agriculture to establish state grades and standards of quality and identity for unpasteurized butter.

HB 2548

(4:25 PM) Directs Legislative Policy and Research Office to study issues related to funding construction of wildlife corridor road crossings and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.
