Public Hearing

HB 3037

(8:00 am) Directs medical examiner to report suspected suicides involving decedents 24 years of age or younger to local mental health authority.

HB 2381

(8:25 am) Modifies laws relating to youth suicide intervention and prevention to include children under 10 years of age.

HB 3139

(8:50 am) Requires parental disclosure when minor receives suicide risk assessment, intervention, treatment or support services.

HB 2585

(9:15 am) CARRIED OVER FROM THE 02/17/2021 AGENDA: Imposes requirements upon mental health treatment professionals and programs to ensure culturally and linguistically affirmative mental health services for individuals who are deaf, deaf-blind or hard of hearing.

Oral Testimony (Live Remotely)
