Work Session

HB 2945

Requires school districts to ensure that students for whom out-of-school suspensions or expulsions have been imposed receive specified services during suspensions or expulsions.

HB 3354

Directs Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to adopt standards for educator preparation programs relating to evaluations of teacher candidates.

HB 2408

Directs Department of Education to conduct study on meeting students' behavioral health needs and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education by September 1, 2021.

HB 3294

Requires every public education provider to provide certain feminine hygiene products at no cost to students.

HB 2001

Requires school district that is making reductions in educator staff positions to retain teacher with less seniority if teacher has more merit and if retention of teacher is necessary to maintain school district's diversity ratio.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3350

Prescribes requirements for providing education to student with disability during COVID-19 emergency.

HB 2802 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Allows school district with remote small high school to use moneys received under High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Act on existing career and technical education programs.

HB 2793 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys to Department of Education for distribution to certain school districts for certain career and technical education programs.

Note change: HB 2945 and HB 3354 have been added.

- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
