HB 3106

(1:40 pm) Provides that, for purposes of electric companies' planning and pursuit of energy efficiency resources, energy efficiency programs include programs for assisting retail electricity consumers with replacing building heating, appliances and other technologies powered by any energy source with higher-efficiency electric heating, appliances and other technologies.

HB 2189

(1:55 pm) Directs Public Utility Commission to conduct study related to renewable energy and to provide results of study in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to energy no later than September 15, 2021.

HB 2241

(2:10 pm) Requires Department of Environmental Quality to approve at least three businesses to provide water quality permit application review services.

HB 3375 **

(2:30 pm) Establishes goal of planning for development of three gigawatts of commercial scale floating offshore wind energy projects within federal waters off Oregon Coast by 2030.
