HB 2021

(1:05 pm) Directs Public Utility Commission to study laws related to clean energy and provide results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

HB 2143 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(1:15 pm) Changes annual fees for all power claimants to match annual fees for other hydroelectric projects.

HB 2398

(1:25 pm) Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to ensure that statewide Reach Code mandates achievement of not more than 90 percent of site energy use that other statewide residential and commercial building codes require.

HB 2488 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(1:35 pm) Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to make changes to statewide land use planning goals by December 31, 2026, to address climate justice by addressing climate change adaptation and mitigation and environmental justice for disadvantaged communities.

HB 2495

(1:45 pm) Revises provisions relating to chemicals in children's products.

HB 2520

(1:55 pm) Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to amend statewide land use planning goals related to energy conservation to incorporate development of renewable energy facilities and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and to match state energy policies.

HB 2814

(2:05 pm) Directs Environmental Quality Commission to establish and implement indirect source review program.

HB 3180

(2:15 pm) Modifies and adds laws related to utilities.

HB 3278

(2:25 pm) Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife, in consultation with Department of State Lands and State Parks and Recreation Department, to study potential for developing commercial seaweed production to produce feed for livestock as means to reduce methane emissions.

HB 3375 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(2:35 pm) Establishes goal of planning for development of three gigawatts of commercial scale floating offshore wind energy projects within federal waters off Oregon Coast by 2030.
