HB 3078

(3:20 pm) Prohibits Oregon State Lottery from offering games playable via mobile phone, personal computer or other personal electronic device, except for certain sports betting and multistate numbers drawing lottery games.

HB 3252 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(3:40 pm) Allows Governor to enter into agreement with another state to allow for transportation of marijuana items to and from this state through other state.

HB 3253 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(3:50 pm) Repeals operative date provision for law allowing Governor to enter into agreement with another state for cross-jurisdictional coordination and delivery of marijuana items.

HB 2416 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

(4:00 pm) Directs State Department of Agriculture to advance design of cannabis business certification program.

- HB 2445 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
(4:10 pm) Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items.
- HB 2111
(4:20 pm) Changes name of "Oregon Liquor Control Commission" to "Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission."
Declares emergency, effective August 2, 2021.
- HB 3082
(4:30 pm) Raises contract price at which public improvement contract solicitations are exempt from competitive bidding requirement from \$5,000 to \$10,000.
- HB 2742
(4:40 pm) Allows holder of off-premises sales license to sell factory-sealed containers of malt beverages that hold more than seven gallons.
- HB 2363
(4:50 pm) Allows certain holders of temporary event licenses to sell alcoholic beverages for on and off-premises consumption at more than one location on licensed premises.

- Registration closes at the time the meeting is scheduled to begin.
- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
