HB 3134

(1:05 pm - 1:20 pm) Replaces references to vehicle accident and vehicle collision with vehicle crash.

HB 3140

(1:20 pm - 1:45 pm) Makes changes to statutes related to operating vehicle or boat while under influence of intoxicants that reference controlled substances to clarify applicability to psilocybin. HB 3136

(1:45 pm-2:10 pm) Provides that person who operates motor vehicle upon premises open to public or highways of this state is deemed to have given consent to submit to drug recognition evaluation under certain circumstances.

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Work Session

HB 2650

Authorizes emergency medical services providers to transport or treat police dogs injured in line of duty, provided that such transportation or treatment does not interfere with emergency transportation or treatment of humans.

HB 2539

Provides that juror may not be identified by name in court proceeding open to public.

Please note: HB 2481 is scheduled solely for the purpose of committee discussion of amendments to the bill.

HB 2481

Prohibits law enforcement agencies from receiving certain military surplus equipment from federal government.

HB 2049 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Innovative Grant Fund. HB 2176

Eliminates minimum amount of fee added to judgment that includes monetary obligation that court or judicial branch is charged with collecting.

HB 2178 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Modifies provisions relating to fees in tax court.
