Public Hearing

HB 2169

(1:00 - 1:30 pm) Directs Racial Justice Council to study potential changes to criminal justice system and to provide results of study to Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

HB 2172

(1:30 - 2:00 pm) Converts mandatory minimum sentences for specified felonies other than murder to presumptive sentences.

HB 2003

(2:00-2:30 pm) Expands membership of Public Defense Services Commission from seven to nine members.

Work Session

HB 2481

Prohibits law enforcement agencies from receiving certain military surplus equipment from federal government.

Please note: HB 2513, HB 2928, and HB 2986 are scheduled solely for the purpose of committee discussion:

HB 2513

Requires police officers to be trained in airway and circulatory anatomy and physiology and certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

HB 2928

Regulates use of chemical incapacitants, kinetic impact projectiles and sound devices by law enforcement agencies.

HB 2986

Requires Board on Public Safety Standards and Training to ensure that police officers and certified reserve officers are trained to investigate, identify and report crimes motivated by prejudice based on perceived gender of victim.

Note change: HB 2513, HB 2928, and HB 2986 Work Sessions added. HB 2177 Work Session removed.
