SB 186

SB 188 A

(1:25 - 1:35 pm) Clarifies that state felony traffic offenses charged in Multnomah County will be heard in court facility in Portland.

SB 220

(1:35 - 1:50 pm) Prescribes formalities for remote attestation of writing.

SB 296 A

(1:50 - 2:10 pm) Authorizes Chief Justice of Supreme Court, during period of statewide emergency and upon finding of good cause, to extend or suspend time period or time requirement in rule or statute in specified court proceedings.

SB 297

(2:10 - 2:30 pm) Provides that judicial marshal certified by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System.

Work Session

SB 109

Directs State Parks and Recreation Commission to adopt rules managing use of unmanned aircraft systems by people in state parks.

Please note: SB 109 Work Session scheduled solely for the purpose of committee discussion.

SB 315

Exempts from required disclosure business, commercial, financial, operational and research data and information that is furnished, developed or generated in connection with ownership or operation of unmanned aerial system test range, if disclosure of information would cause competitive disadvantage to test range or users.

- Registration closes at the time the meeting is scheduled to begin.
- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
