SB 649

Please note: SB 649 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from those previously signed up to testify at the 5/18/21 meeting.

Increases penalties for criminal sexual contact with underage victim when defendant is victim's teacher.

SB 836 A

Please note: SB 836 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from those previously signed up to testify at the 5/18/21 meeting.

Directs Department of Corrections to consider all other alternatives before suspending or terminating alternative incarceration program in its entirety for more than five consecutive days.

Work Session

SJM 2

Urges Congress to amend Thirteenth Amendment to United States Constitution to omit clause excepting criminal punishment, thereby ending racist legacy of slavery in nation's most important document.

SJM 4

Urges Congress to enact legislation to begin process of implementing reparations for African Americans based on slavery and discrimination.

SJR 10

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit slavery and involuntary servitude in all circumstances.

SB 181

Directs court to consider, in determining amount of award of attorney fees, whether attorney performed services on pro bono basis or award of attorney fees otherwise promotes access to justice.

SB 185 A

Specifies circumstances under which members of nonprofit corporation and board of directors of nonprofit corporation may discuss issues or take action by electronic means without meeting.

SB 649

Increases penalties for criminal sexual contact with underage victim when defendant is victim's teacher.

Recommended from the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Civil Law:

SB 190 A

Modifies permissible methods of providing notice of appointment of guardian to protected person.

SB 221

Modifies court procedure for determining whether decedent intended writing to be decedent's will, partial or complete revocation of decedent's will or addition to or alteration of decedent's will.

SB 295 A

Defines terms related to fitness to proceed.

SB 572

Modifies protective proceedings to permit vulnerable youth guardianships for adults between 18 and 21 years of age who are eligible for special immigrant status and who are unable to be reunified with parent due to abuse, neglect or abandonment that occurred before adult attained 18 years of age.

SB 578 A

Requires court, under certain circumstances, to appoint legal counsel for respondent or protected person in protective proceeding.

SB 768 A

Modifies provisions relating to attorneys.
