- HB 2174 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
(1:05 pm) Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services, upon request of county governing body, to credit forest reserve moneys that would otherwise be credited to county road fund to certain public bodies whose service areas include entire county.
- HB 2312  
(1:25 pm) Provides that lawful units of land whose property lines are relocated by certain judgments remain lawful units.
- HB 2884  
(1:45 pm) Extends time for recording partition plat incorporating city or county's permit validating unit of land to 365 days.
- HB 2837  
(2:05 pm) Removes designation of rural reserves from private road commonly known as Lasich Lane in Washington County.
