Public Hearing

SB 483 A

(1:05 pm) Creates rebuttable presumption that person violated prohibition against retaliation or discrimination against employee or prospective employee if person takes certain action against employee or prospective employee within 60 days after employee or prospective employee has engaged in certain protected activities.

HB 2486

(1:25 pm) Requires, on or after October 1, 2021, officials of public bodies to grant news media representatives access to scenes of emergencies or emergency police activity that are otherwise closed to public.

Please note: HB 3112 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing the -13 amendments.

HB 2060

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-4-2021 AGENDA: (2:15 pm) Identifies economically disadvantaged students based on State Board of Education rule for purposes of Student Investment Account distributions.

HB 2166

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-4-2021 AGENDA: (2:30 pm) Directs Superintendent of Public Instruction to convene advisory group to review equity in education system of state and to report results of review to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

Work Session

HB 3021

Requires Secretary of State to create and make publicly available list of five most common languages spoken by residents of state.

HB 2485

Requires state agencies to reduce public records request fees by 50 percent if request is made in public interest, and requires state agencies to entirely waive fees if public records request is in public interest and narrowly tailored.
