Possible Work Session

SB 236
Directs Early Learning Division to conduct study on use of suspension and expulsion in early childhood care and education programs and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

SB 226
Directs Department of Education to conduct study on education system of state and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

Work Session

SB 602
Removes sunset on requirement that students must receive certain information related to statewide summative assessments.

SB 356
Creates position of School Nurse Specialist in Department of Education.

SB 594
Prohibits school district boards from authorizing, and school districts from using, certain monitoring software related to students' computer usage.
