#### Work Session

SB 464

Requires tax collector to prorate and cancel property taxes imposed on taxable property destroyed or damaged by wildfire during September 2020 in county covered by state of emergency declared in response to wildfire as if property were destroyed property under current law.

HB 2693

Allows exception to requirement for property tax exemption that property of industry apprenticeship or training trust be actually and exclusively occupied and used for purposes of industry apprenticeship or training trust for occasional use by corporation exempt from federal income tax for purposes for which corporation is granted federal exemption.

SB 806

Modifies definition of "malt beverage" for purpose of regulation and taxation of alcoholic beverages to align more closely with federal statutory definition of "beer." Increases alcohol by volume threshold percentage requiring additional privilege tax imposed on wine to match federal tax classification percentage.

#### Public Hearing

HB 2008 B

Provides tax exemption for property of religious organization held or used solely to provide affordable housing to low income households.

SB 139

Reduces amount of income eligible for elective reduced personal income tax rate allowed for certain pass-through income.
