Public Hearing

SB 266

Requires Department of Human Services to study and make recommendations to interim committees of Legislative Assembly, no later than September 15, 2022, for legislative changes needed to improve care of residents and training of staff in long term care facilities.

SB 267

Requires Department of Human Services to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services any changes needed to statutes governing programs administered by department due to changes to budget.

SB 714

Establishes minimum staffing ratio for residential care facilities and facilities with memory care endorsements.

SB 4

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Directs Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations for improving coordination of youth mental health services among state agencies.

SB 49

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Modifies employment-related child care subsidy program to require certain individuals associated with care provider to be enrolled in Central Background Registry.

SB 50

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Requires operators, employees and volunteers of preschool recorded programs and school-age recorded programs to be enrolled in Central Background Registry.

SB 84

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Directs Department of Human Services to prepare report regarding Strengthening, Preserving and Reunifying Families programs and make recommendations for legislation.

SB 85

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Modifies family-based group home placements to permit respite time for providers.

SB 279

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Directs Department of Human Services, to extent practicable, to avoid scheduling meetings and appointments involving child in foster care during school day.

SB 757

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2021 MEETING: Limits availability of conditional enrollment in Central Background Registry to individuals who have successfully completed criminal background check in Oregon and, if applicable, in state of residence.

SB 142 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Extends sunset for tax credit for child with disability.

SB 144 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Extends sunset for additional personal exemption credit for taxpayer with severe disability.

SB 146 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Extends sunset for tax credit for working family dependent care.

SB 556

Specifies that on-site inspections must be in person for child-caring agencies, proctor foster homes, private residential boarding schools, foster homes, youth offender foster homes, health care facilities, home health agencies, residential facilities, adult foster homes, developmental disability child foster homes, hospice programs and qualified residential treatment programs.

SB 707

Directs Department of Human Services to provide certain notices to children and wards whom department placed in out-of-state residential facilities between January 1, 2016, and June 30, 2020, and to provide representatives of children and wards with certain documentation and information.

SB 710

Modifies allowed and prohibited uses of restraint of children in care by child-caring agencies, proctor foster homes and developmental disabilities residential facilities.

SB 749

Requires residential care referral agent to be registered with Department of Human Services.
