Directs medical examiner to report suspected suicides involving decedents 24 years of age or younger to local mental health authority.
- HB 2102 A  
Requires Department of Human Services to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services, by December 31, 2022, comprehensive proposal for department staffing that meets specified criteria.
- HB 2106  
Renames Children's Advocate to Human Services Ombudsperson.

- HB 2117  
Repeals Oregon Board of Psychology authority to issue initial psychologist associate licenses.
- HB 2119 A  
Transfers responsibility for 2-1-1 system from Office of Emergency Management to Department of Human Services.

HB 2315 A

Directs Oregon Health Authority and specified professional regulatory boards to require licensees regulated by authority or board to complete continuing education related to suicide risk assessment, treatment and management at specified intervals and to report completion of continuing education to authority or board.

HB 3139 A

Requires mental health care provider who assesses minor to be at imminent and serious threat of attempting suicide to disclose relevant information to parent, guardian or other individuals to engage in safety planning.

HB 2469 A

Requires state medical assistance program to provide mental health wellness appointments as prescribed by Oregon Health Authority.
