(8:35 am) Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Office of Governor for purpose of funding office of Corrections Ombudsman.

SB 178

(9:00 am) Provides that property owner consent is defense to theft or criminal mistreatment in the first degree if defendant did not know, or have reason to know, that consent was gained through improper influence, harassment, duress, force, compulsion, coercion or enticement or that owner lacked capacity to consent.

Work Session

SB 201

Provides that person commits offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants if person has blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or more by weight within two hours after driving vehicle.
