Public Hearing

SB 401

Converts mandatory minimum sentences for specified felonies other than murder to presumptive sentences.

Please note: If public testimony remains to be heard after the regularly scheduled hearing time, the public hearing may be continued later the same day.

Work Session

SB 731

Modifies provisions relating to tribal police officers.

SB 221

Modifies court procedure for determining whether decedent intended writing to be decedent's will, partial or complete revocation of decedent's will or addition to or alteration of decedent's will.

SB 728

Modifies provisions of law relating to administration of decedents' estates.

March 23, 2021

SB 175

Allows certain assistant attorneys general to use employment address on certain records maintained by Department of Transportation.

SB 578

Requires court, under certain circumstances, to appoint legal counsel for respondent or protected person in protective proceeding.

SB 187

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/21 AGENDA: Defines "dangerous to self or others" for purpose of taking person with mental illness into custody.

SB 189

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/21 AGENDA: Requires outpatient care as condition for trial visit of person committed to custody of Oregon Health Authority as person with mental illness.

SB 190

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/21 AGENDA: Modifies permissible methods of providing notice of appointment of guardian to protected person.
