### Public Hearing

HB 3273 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/12/21 AGENDA: Prohibits law enforcement agency from releasing booking photo except in specified circumstances.

HB 3355 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/12/21 AGENDA: Specifies identification required on uniforms of law enforcement officers working in crowd management in city with population over 150,000.

***Please note: HB 3273 A and HB 3355 A are scheduled solely for the purpose of taking public testimony from individuals signed up to testify at the 5/12/21 meeting.***

HB 2935 A

Limits authority of school district to become member of voluntary organization that administers interscholastic activities unless organization implements equity focused policies that meet certain requirements.

## **AGENDA (cont.)**

### **May 13, 2021**

HB 3176 A

Permits chief administrative law judge to require implied consent hearing to be conducted by telephone or other two-way communication device if judge determines that meeting in person poses significant risk to health or safety.

HB 3229 A

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to convene advisory council to assist with recommendations related to health care standards in local correctional facilities.

*Note change: Public Hearings on HB 2929 A and HB 2936 A added.*
