#### Public Hearing

SB 465

Requires counties to allow commencement of restoration or replacement of nonconforming uses damaged or destroyed by certain wildfires until September 30, 2025.

SB 405

Tolls time city or county may consider nonconforming use interrupted or abandoned during emergency that limits resumption of use.

Eliminates sunset on Columbia River Fisheries Enhancement Fund.
- SB 126  
Allows Department of State Lands to expand estuarine research reserve management area to include other lands acquired by department connected to Coos Bay estuary.
