Different Forest Ownerships Can Play Differ Roles In Sustainability

- Private Forestlands
 - Production forests focused on providing economic values
- Federal Forestlands
 - Provides the bulk of environmental and social values (Reserves, wilderness etc.)
- State Forests
 - Integrated multi-value forests with opportunity for innovative management
