

OHCS Programs Funded by the Public Purpose Charge (PPC)

OHCS administers 16.2% of PPC funds

- 11.7% Low-Income Weatherization Programs
 - Energy Conservation Helping Oregonians (ECHO)
 - Oregon Multifamily Energy Program (OR-MEP)
- 4.5% Housing Development Grant Program (HDGP)





Energy Conservation Helping Oregonians (ECHO)

- Provides weatherization for low-income households that are customers of PGE or Pacific Power
- ECHO can pay for:
 - Ceiling, wall, and floor insulation
 - Energy-related minor home repairs
 - Energy conservation education
 - Air infiltration reduction

- Furnace repair and replacement
- Heating duct improvements
- Health and safety improvements
- Program resources: \$16,553,094 (July 2017 June 2019)





Oregon Multifamily Energy Program (OR-MEP)

- Energy efficiency measures for affordable housing
- Program resources: \$3,310,619 (July 2017 – June 2019)

Housing Development Grant Program (HDGP)

- 4.5% of PPC funds support the HDGP
- HDGP is used to develop affordable homes for low-income Oregonians
- Program resources: \$8,489,462 (July 2017 – June 2019)
