
Vision/Mission/Values



Emergency Management Structures

- ORS 401 and authorities
 - 401.032 places responsibility "at the local level"
- Local Emergency Management
 - Counties must, cities may
 - Different structures and capacity state-wide
- Tribal
 - Government to government relationship
 - Relationships with counties, the state, and federal agencies
- State OFM
 - Serves as the coordinating agency for state response through State Emergency Coordination Center (State ECC)
 - Connection to local and federal response
 - Subject Matter Expertise, Guidance and support
 - Grant management



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 19-02

DETERMINATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY IN COOS, CURRY, DESCRIUTES, DOUGLAS, JACKSON, JOSEPHINE, KLAMATH, LANE, LINN, AND MARION COUNTIES DUE TO A SEVERE WINTER STORM THAT INCLUDES HEAVY SNOW AND ICE ACCUMULATION, HIGH WINDS, FLOODING, AND LANDSLIDES

Pursuant to ORS 4011.62 find a potential threat to life, safety, property, and ignificant damage to infrastructure exists due to severe where storms that have custed and continue to cause a natural disaster throughout the state. Beginning the continue of the continue

IT IS ORDERED AND DIRECTED:

- The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) shall activate the State's Emergency Operations Plan and Emergency Coordination Center, and shall coordinate access to and use of personnel and equipment of all state agencies necessary to assess, alleviate, respond to, mitigate, or recover from conditions caused by this emergency. OEM shall coordinate all essential protective measures in support of identified disaster areas to protect lives, property, and the environment.
- OEM shall work with neighboring states where needed to ensure coordinated response and mitigation actions.
- 3. The Origon National Quand, Oregon State Police, Oregon Public Utility Commission, Oregon Department of Human Services, and Oregon Health Authority shall provide a more properly of the Police of Poli
- The Oregon Department of Transportation shall provide appropriate assistance and seek federal resources to ensure repair and reconstruction of damage and impacts to the federal highway system in above identified
