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Measure 110 Requirements for OHA

Requires OHA to administer and support all aspects of implementation.

Key Dates

- Feb. 1, 2021:
 - Established Temporary 24/7 Telephone Addiction Recovery Center (T.A.R.C.)
 - Established Oversight and Accountability Council (OAC)
- June 30, 2021:

OAC to adopt rules and establish general criteria and requirements for A.R.C.'s and Community Access to Care Grants

- Oct. 1, 2021:
 - Establish and operationalize 24/7 A.R.C.'s throughout the state



Expanding Treatment Services and Supports

- 24/7 access to triage services
- Comprehensive Health Assessment
- Increase access peer support and peer delivered services
- Expanded outreach and engagement (mobile and virtual services)
- Intensive case management
- Care Coordination/Care connection to services and supports
- Expanding low barrier access to treatment that is patient centered, trauma informed and culturally responsive
- Increased access to housing for persons with substance use disorders -- stable, supportive and permanent
- Increased interventions for overdose prevention education and other substance-specific drug education and outreach
- Increased access to naloxone and sterile syringes



Oversight and Accountability Council

Required perspectives for council members:

- People with lived experience of substance use or SUD
- Recovery peers
- Members of communities that have been disproportionately impacted by law enforcement related to substances
- Physicians specializing in addiction medicine
- Licensed Clinical Social Workers
- Evidence-based substance use disorder providers
- Harm reduction services providers
- People specializing in housing services for people with BH issues
- Academic researchers specializing in drug use or drug policy
- Mental or behavioral health providers
- Representatives of a CCO
- Non-profit advocates



Updates: Oversight and Accountability Council

- OHA received 181 applications selection process prioritized lived experience and racial equity
- 21 Council Appointees:
 - Representatives from a wide variety of communities, perspectives, and experiences
 - 2 members from the ADPC
 - Representation from the Tribes (enrolled members and Tribal Leaders)
 - Representation from the Coast, I-5 Corridor, Southern, Central, and Eastern Oregon
 - Representation from all perspectives required by the Measure
- Appointments were made and members notified by Feb. 1, 2021



Updates: T.A.R.C.

- Contracted with Lines for Life as a Telephone Addiction Recovery Center (T.A.R.C.)
 - T.A.R.C. went live Feb. 1, 2021
 - Partnering with law enforcement and courts to relay communication to individuals that have been cited about health assessment completion to waive citation fee
 - Partnering with M110 supporters
- Services and Supports provided at T.A.R.C.
 - 24/7 triage
 - Health assessment
 - Individual intervention plans including but not limited to:
 - Treatment, housing, recovery supports, harm reduction, health, employment, childcare, training
 - Case management and care coordination and connection




Developing Staffing

- Respond to our community service providers and stakeholders who are seeking information or ways to participate in the measure's work.



Alignment with Behavioral Health Framework







OHA recommendations for successful implementation

- **Funding:** Maintain existing level of funding for services and supports. The measure shifts marijuana tax dollars that currently pay for non-Medicaid BH services. Without replacing these dollars, existing services will be negatively impacted.
- Service Array and Integration: The measure does not include the full array of addiction treatment services, nor does it address integration of these services into the current healthcare system.
- Phased Implementation: A phased roll out of A.R.C.'s and community access to care grants, will allow for a thoughtful community focused approach that is equity driven. Building upon and complementing existing services and supports, in each region.
- Workforce: A.R.C.'s are meant to offer services 24/7/365. Trained credentialed workers will be required for assessments. Need qualified, culturally responsive workforce capacity.
