Overview of SB 286

- Renaming the Environmental Justice Task Force (EJTF) to Environmental Justice Council
- Adds ability for additional advisory capacity and resources
- Moves EJTF into DEQ while maintaining ability for engagement with other state agencies
- Development and implementation of environmental vulnerability assessment tool
- ~1 Amendment includes continuation of Interagency Workgroup on Climate Impacts on Impacted Communities







Comparison Chart

Environmental Justice Task Force (EJTF)

- Housed in Governor's Office
- 12 members 4 sit on Advocacy Commissions
- No additional resources beyond travel and meal reimbursement
- Agency liaisons participate in meetings and supply annual report on environmental justice related activities

Environmental Justice Council (EJC)

- Housed in DEQ Director's Office
- 13 members 4 represented by Advocacy Commissions
- Opportunity for additional resources to engage community and natural resources agencies
- Agency liaisons continue to provide annual report and collaborate with each other through Interagency Workgroup
