Federal Relief for Child Care

CARES Act: Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF)

Comprehensive Supports for School-Age Children	\$7.5 million
Emergency Child Care Grants – Phase 3	\$30 million
Emergency Child Care Grants – Phase 4	\$33.1 million
Transfer to ODHS for Family, Friends and Neighbor Providers	\$3 million
Administrative Costs	\$200,000
Total	\$73.8 million

CARES Act: Emergency CCDF Funds

- Emergency Board Action January 8, 2021
 - Approval of \$15.0 million General Fund from the Emergency Fund for assisting residential and day camps that provide child care for families
 - Approval of remaining \$22.9 million in CARES Act expenditures: Emergency CCDF Funds to go to ERDC Emergency Rules Extension, Child Care Supply Building, Child Care Provider Supplies, ELD Staffing, Telehealth
- \$8 million left in Emergency CCDF Funds from approved \$22.9 million
- Allowable uses include "supplementing, not supplanting State, Territory, and Tribal general revenue funds for child care assistance for low-income families"

Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021: CCDF Funds (CAA 2021)

- Notice of Award (February 1, 2021): \$103,766,214
- Same allowable uses and liquidation as funds from the CARES Act
 - Liquidated by September 30, 2023
- New requirement for a spending plan to be submitted by February 27 with more explicit goals for funding
 - Many of these have been modeled after the work Oregon put in place after the first round of CARES Act: Emergency CCDF Funds
 - ELD is working with stakeholders to determine the spending plan, including receiving input from the Early Learning Council
- \$0 copays during COVID-19 for families enrolled in ERDC are a priority
 - \$14.1 million of CARES Act: Emergency CCDF Funds extend \$0 copays through end of March 2021
 - New CAA 2021 dollars are another opportunity to extend the copay through the end of the biennium

Stakeholder Input on CAA 2021 CCDF Spending

- Transition to a more equitable copay structure for families on child care subsidy (ERDC)
- Helping providers cover additional costs during COVID-19 (cleaning, staffing, etc.)
- Helping providers reopen




Opportunity Grants: Focusing Resources to Maintain Supply in Hardest Hit Communities
