Program Description

The mission of the Board of Chiropractic Examiners (OBCE) is to serve the public, regulate the practice of chiropractic care, promote quality, and ensure competent ethical health care. The Board regulates Doctors of Chiropractic Medicine and Certified Chiropractic Assistants through examination, licensing, and disciplinary programs. The seven-member board is appointed by the Governor and composed of five chiropractic physicians and two public members.

CSL Summary and Issues

The 2021-23 CSL is slightly less than the 2019-21 Legislatively Approved Budget due largely to the phase out of \$186,500 Other Funds expenditure limitation for Attorney General costs. This limitation has historically been unused. However, the Board may need to seek additional expenditure limitation during the interim if they face any unanticipated legal costs.

Policy Issues

The Board requested no Policy Option Packages.

Other Significant Issues and Background

The agency's 2021-23 ending balance is projected at around five months of operating reserves as of the Governor's Budget. OBCE will likely need to seek a fee increase for the 2023-25 biennium.
