The Oregon Forest Resources Institute is dedicated to advancing public understanding of forests, forest management and forest products, and encouraging sustainable forestry through landowner education.

FISCAL YEAR	OFRI BUDGET	HARVEST LEVEL
2015-16	\$3.62 million	3.65 billion board feet
2016-17	\$3.70 million	3.69
2017-18	\$3.94 million	3.85
2018-19	\$4.03 million	3.83
2019-20	\$3.88 million	3.54

The Institute's annual budget is between \$3.6 and \$4 million, depending on timber harvest levels.



Talk About Trees: Classroom program


- Serves 140,000 K-8 students annually

• >70,000 forest landowners (10 ac. - 1 million ac.)


