

HB 2912 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Extends pilot program which provides services to adults in custody at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility to address legal issues related to community reentry and reintegration, including employment, housing, benefits, and domestic violence. Updates language. Appropriates \$800,000 to the Criminal Justice Commission to fund the program. Sunsets the program December 31, 2024. Declares an emergency and takes effect July 1, 2021.

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Incarcerated individuals have limited access to attorneys and resources to engage in civil legal work. Federal regulations prohibit legal services organizations, such as Legal Aid Services of Oregon, from providing civil legal services to incarcerated individuals. 45 C.F.R. § 1637. To protect incarcerated individuals' constitutional right to access to the courts, the Department of Corrections provides access to legal libraries, but those resources are prioritized by rule for adults in custody who are raising legal challenges to their conviction or sentence or bringing action related to a condition of their confinement. OAR 291-139-0110 & 0120. In 2019 HB 2631 was passed by the Oregon Legislature, creating a pilot program to address some of these concerns, with a sunset date of December 31, 2021.

HB 2912 would extend the pilot program which provides services to adults in custody at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility to address legal issues related to community reentry and reintegration, including employment, housing, benefits, and domestic violence.
