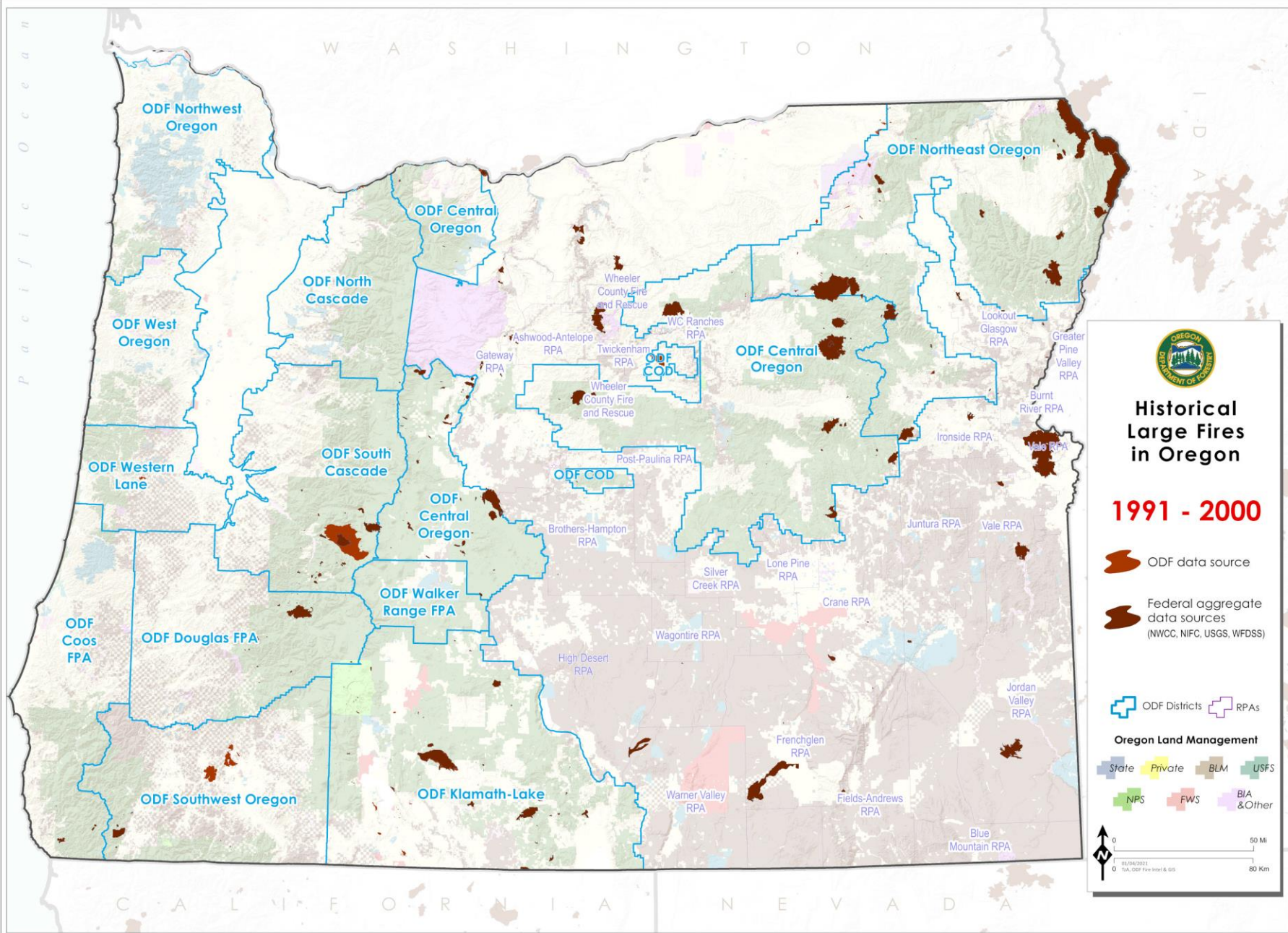

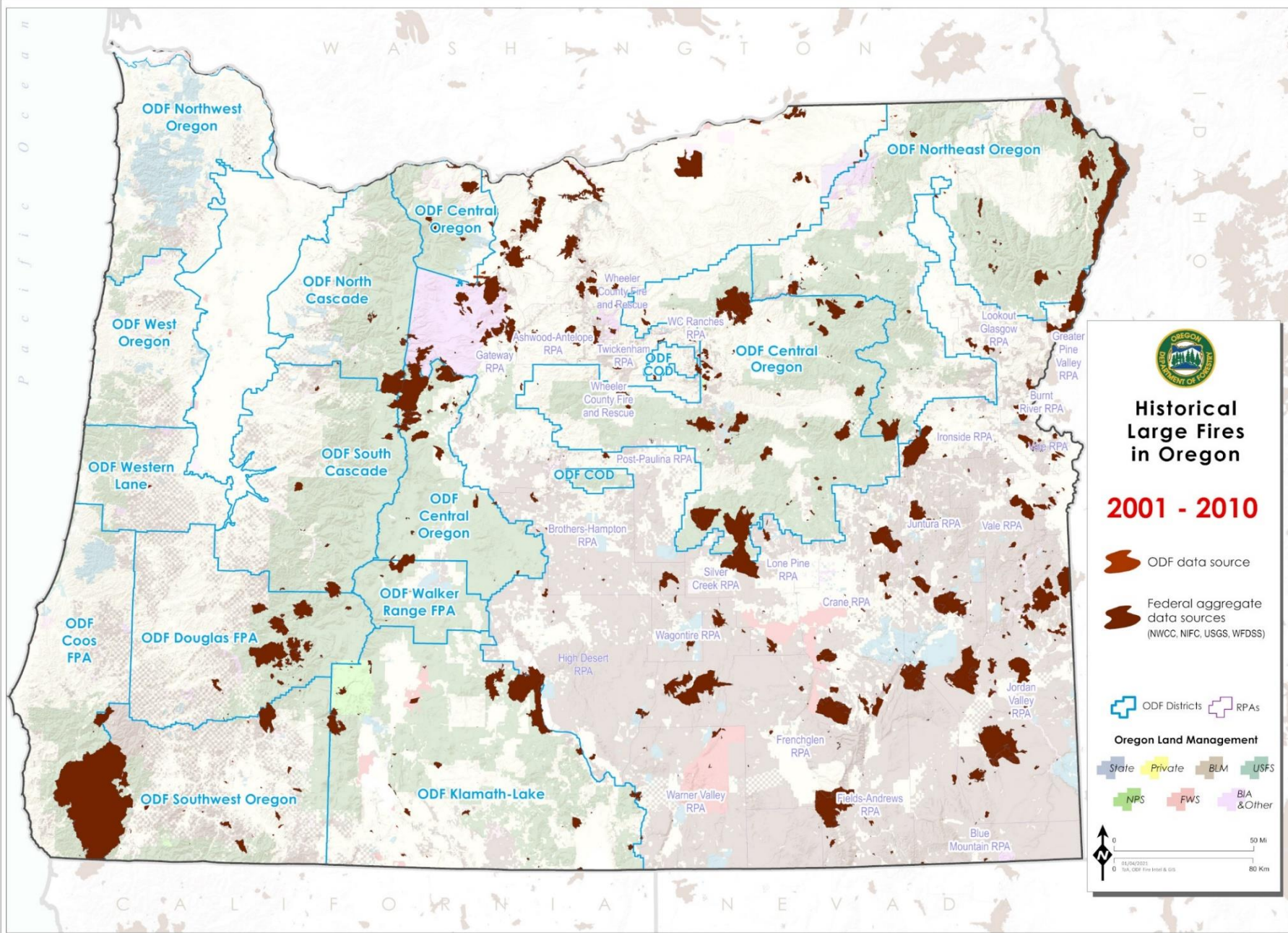

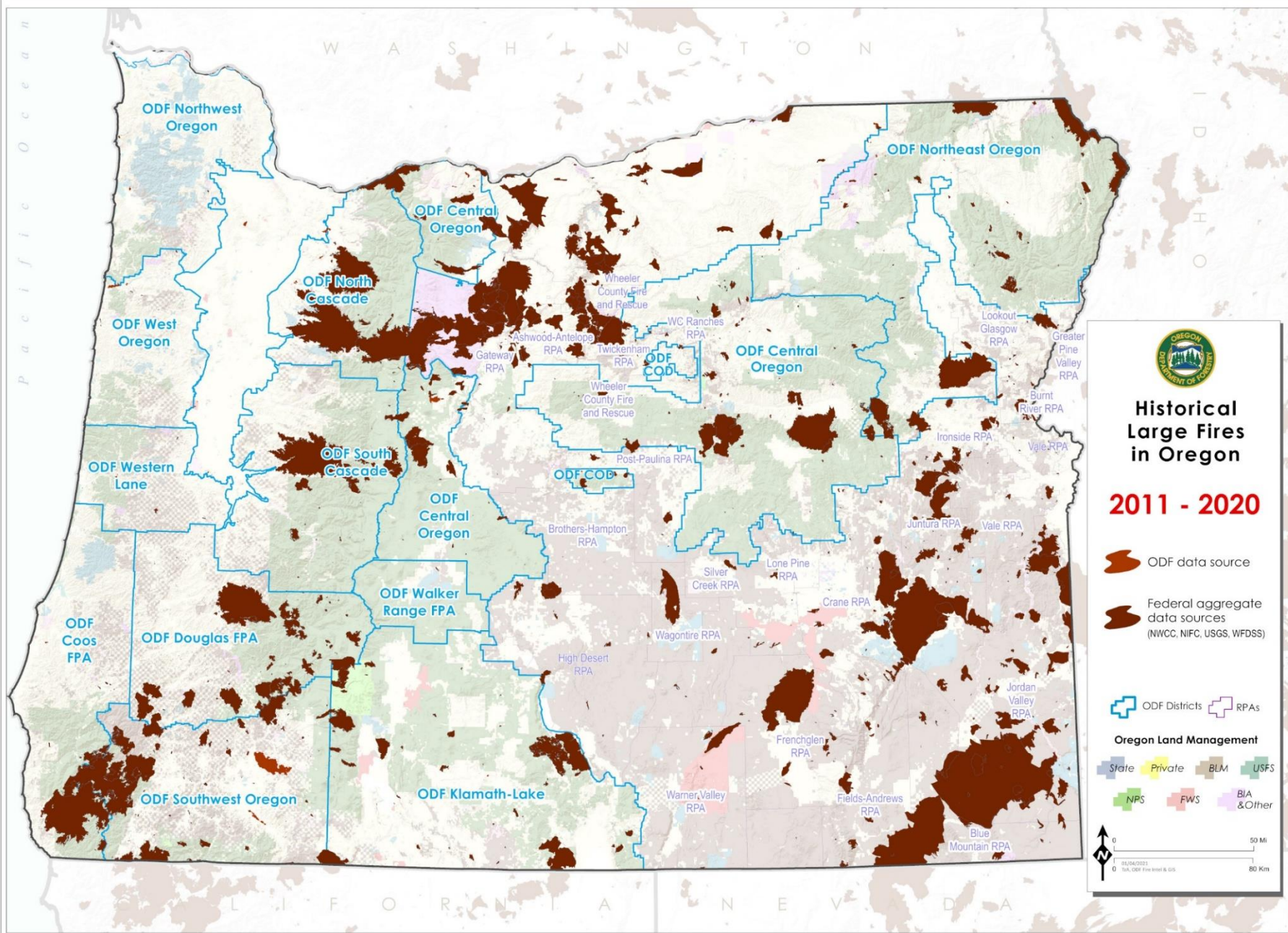

OSFM Response, Prevention and Community Preparedness Capacity

- Regional Response and Community preparedness staff- boots on the ground
 - Statewide capacity and funding in fire safety and training
 - Modernization of response systems and communications
 - Communications capacity and staff
 - Leadership and fiscal capacity for a statewide response- Oregon's fire mutual aid system
- Update: all positions are open or in process, over 75% in the recruitment process

Funding and Support for the Fire Service

- Direct funding for firefighting suppression equipment
 - Funds for training fire service personnel
 - Communications equipment
 - Technology enhancements
 - Personnel protective equipment
 - Support for fire departments with significant losses from 2020 wildfires
- Update: Program already over-subscribed. Program released early February, closes March 15th. Review committee to make selections April. Funds passed through to the fire service May/June.

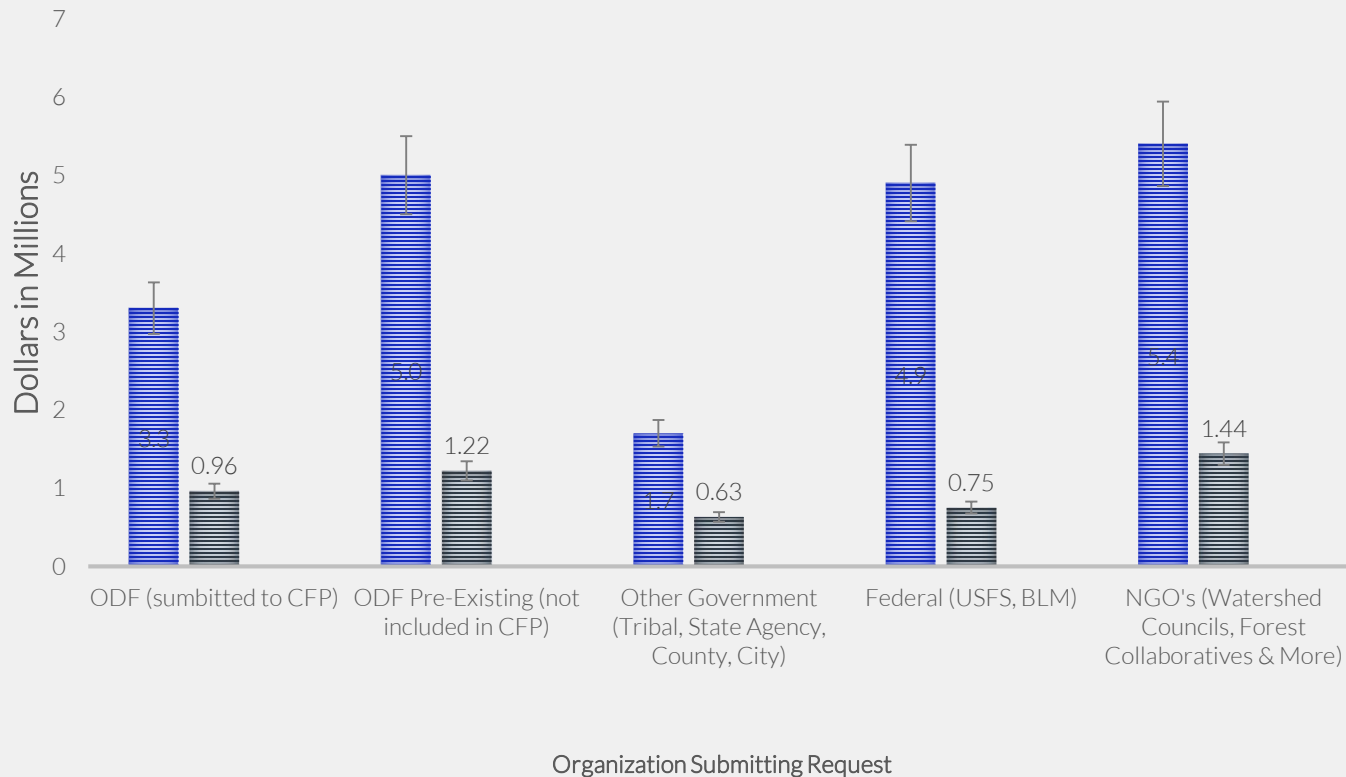
- One Next-Generation
