
Emerging Issues

- Wage claims are up since the new website launch






Bureau of Labor and Industries Expenditure History + 2021-23 Governor's Budget






Budget by Expenditure Category (in millions)

Bureau of Labor and Industries Revenue Sources

- General Fund (GF): Over 37 percent
 - Supports positions and operations in all program areas.
- Other Funds (OF): Nearly 59 percent
 - Sources include fees, publication sales, training, and assessments on unemployment taxes and public works contracts
 - 69 percent of Other Funds support the Wage and Hour Division
- Federal Funds (FF): Four percent
 - Sources include the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and the Department of Housing and Urban Development
 - Federal Funds support the Civil Rights Division and the Commissioner's Office



- Investments: \$2.3M GF, \$0.8M OF, \$0.3M FF
 - Permanent Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Specialist
 - Resources to reduce caseloads and improve claims processing
 - Permanent bilingual position
 - Technical Assistance for Employers
- Reductions: \$0.2M GF, \$2.2M OF, \$20k FF
 - Elimination of inflation on select Services and Supplies
 - Increase in the Vacancy Savings factor to a total of five percent
 - Transfer of \$1.9M OF balance to the General Fund
