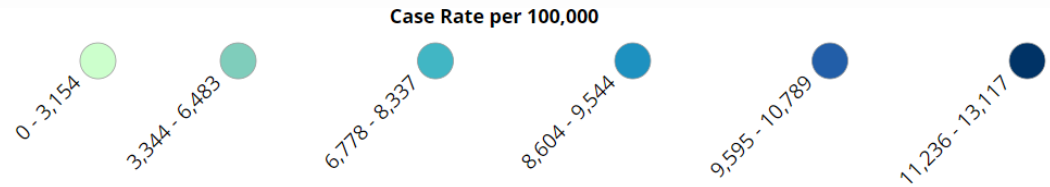
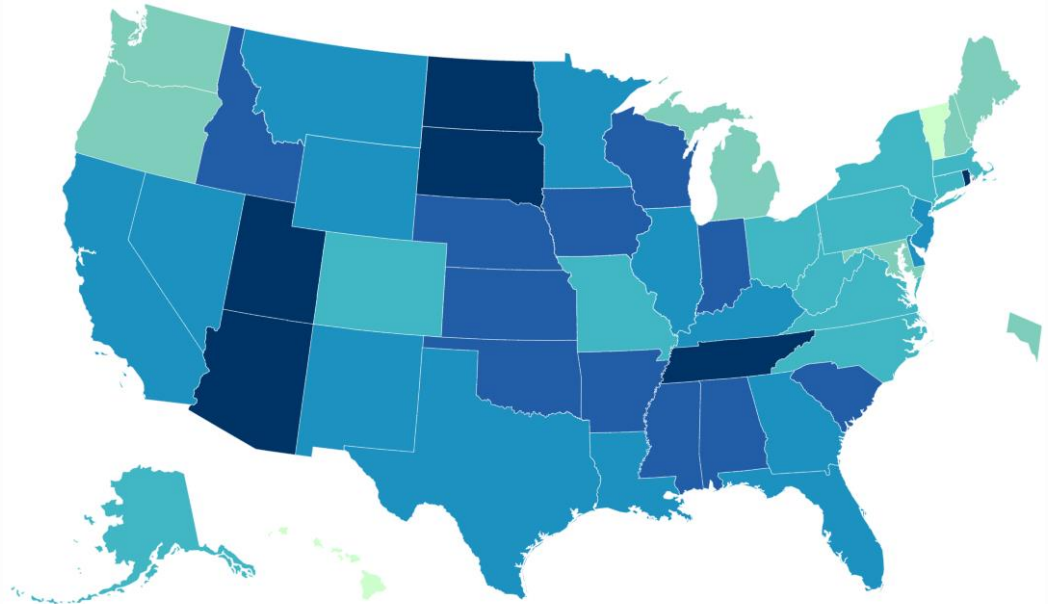

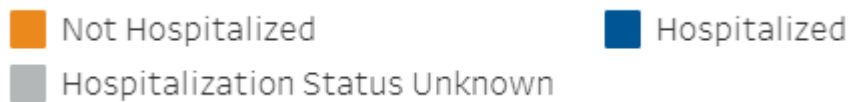
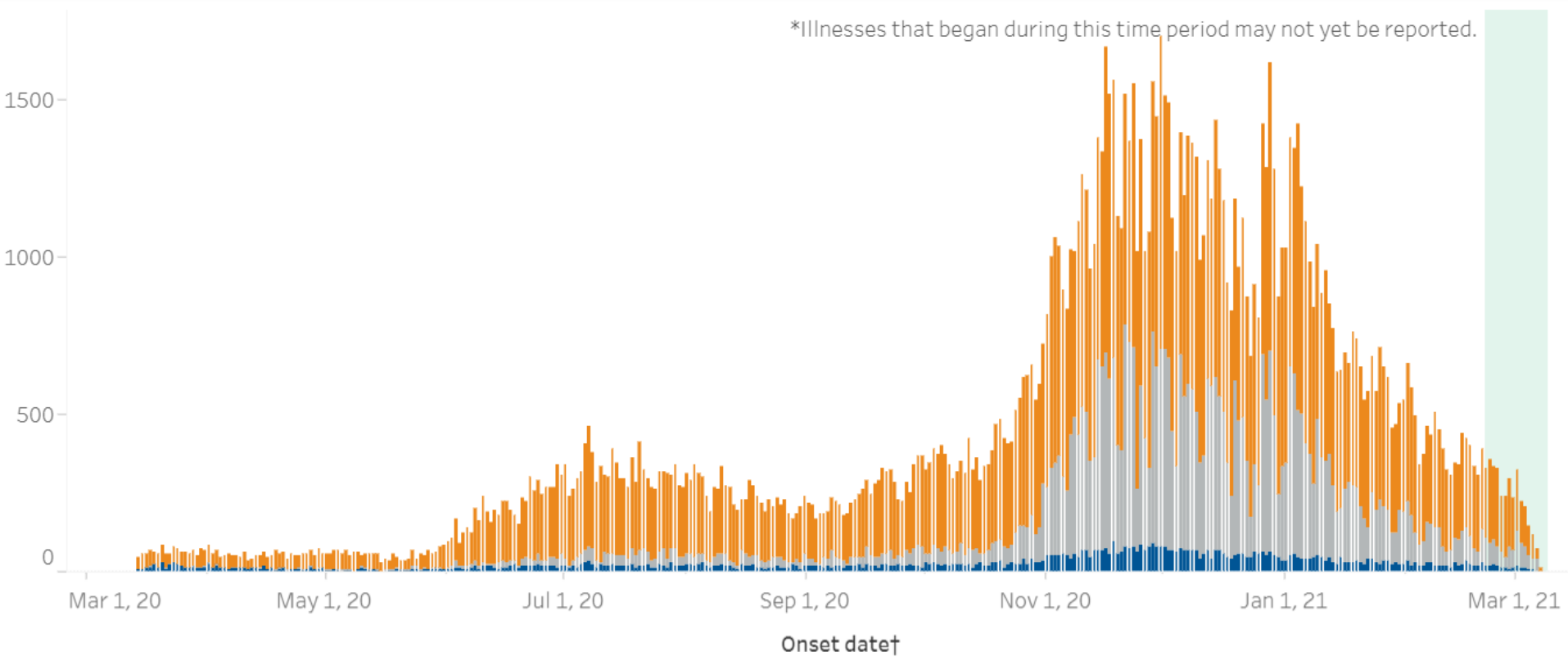

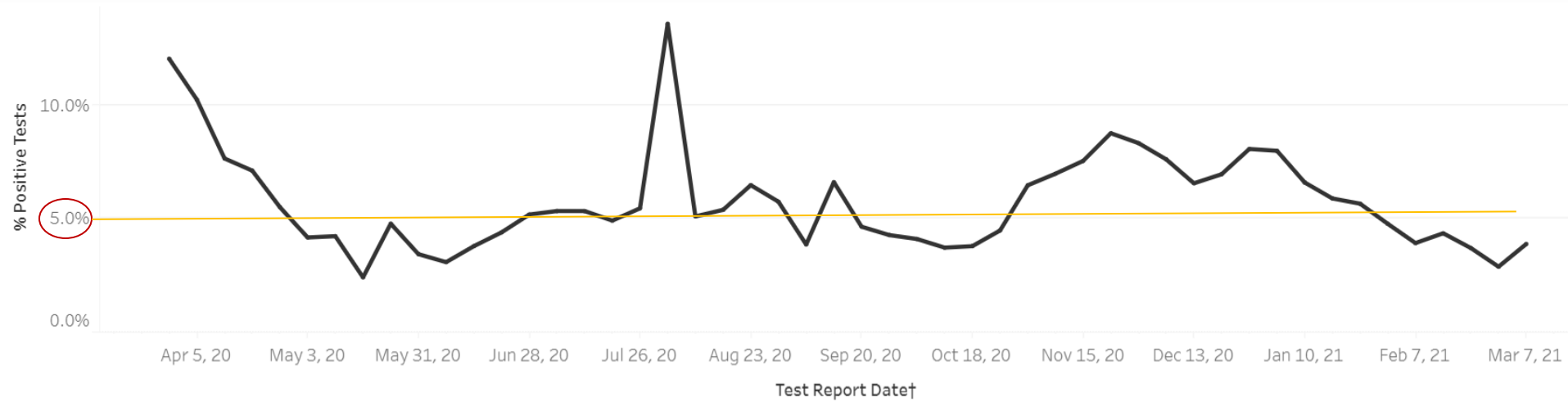


Oregon's Epi Curve

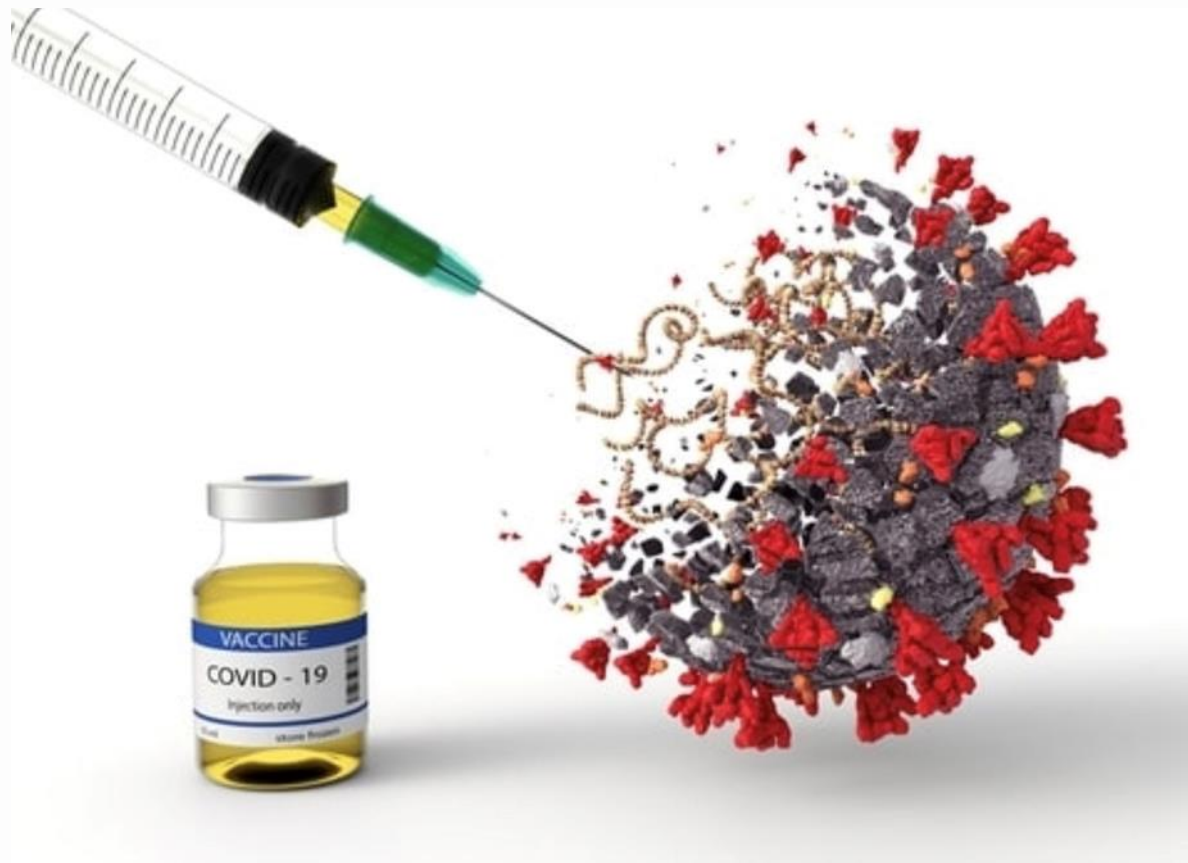


COVID-19 Testing

Test positivity over time

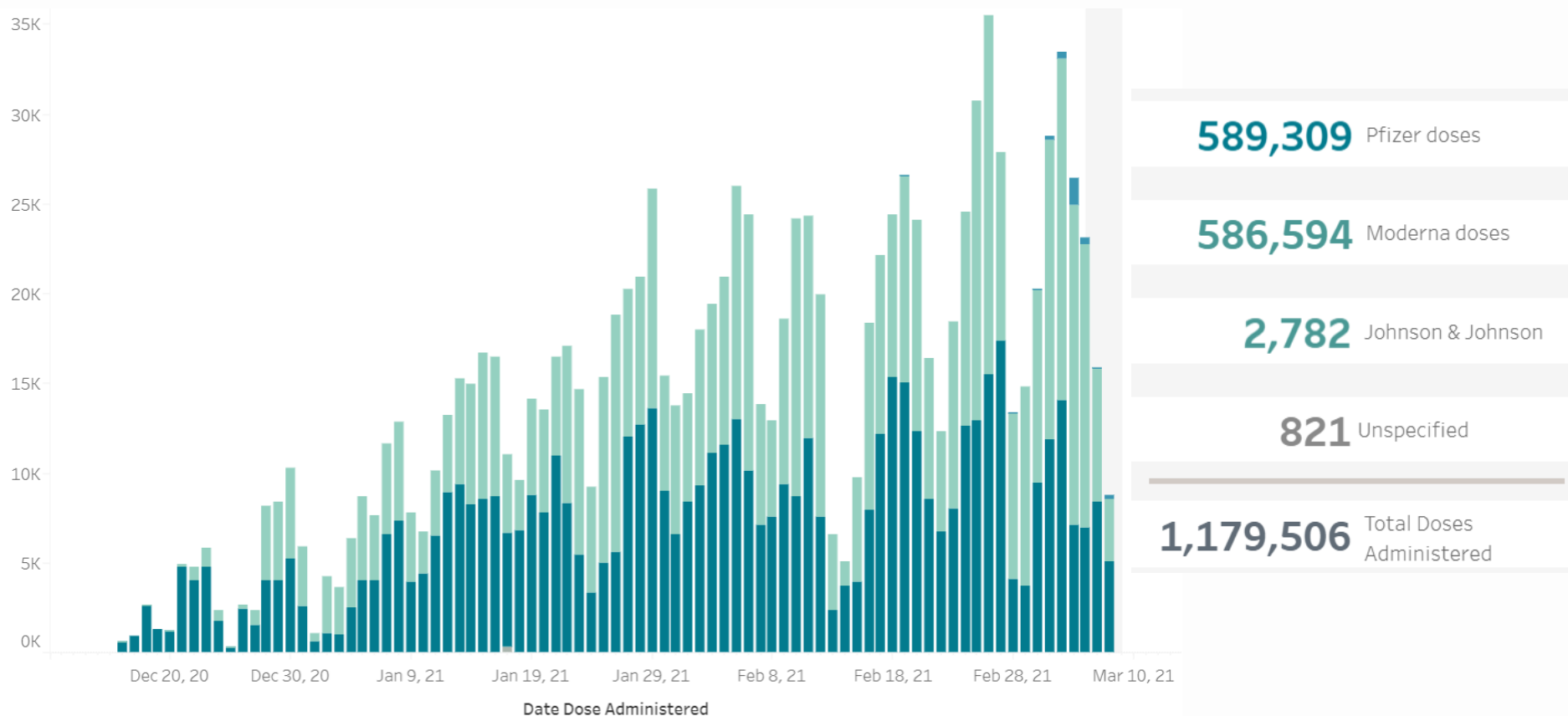


COVID-19 Vaccination Update

- People who have received at least one dose: **750,486**

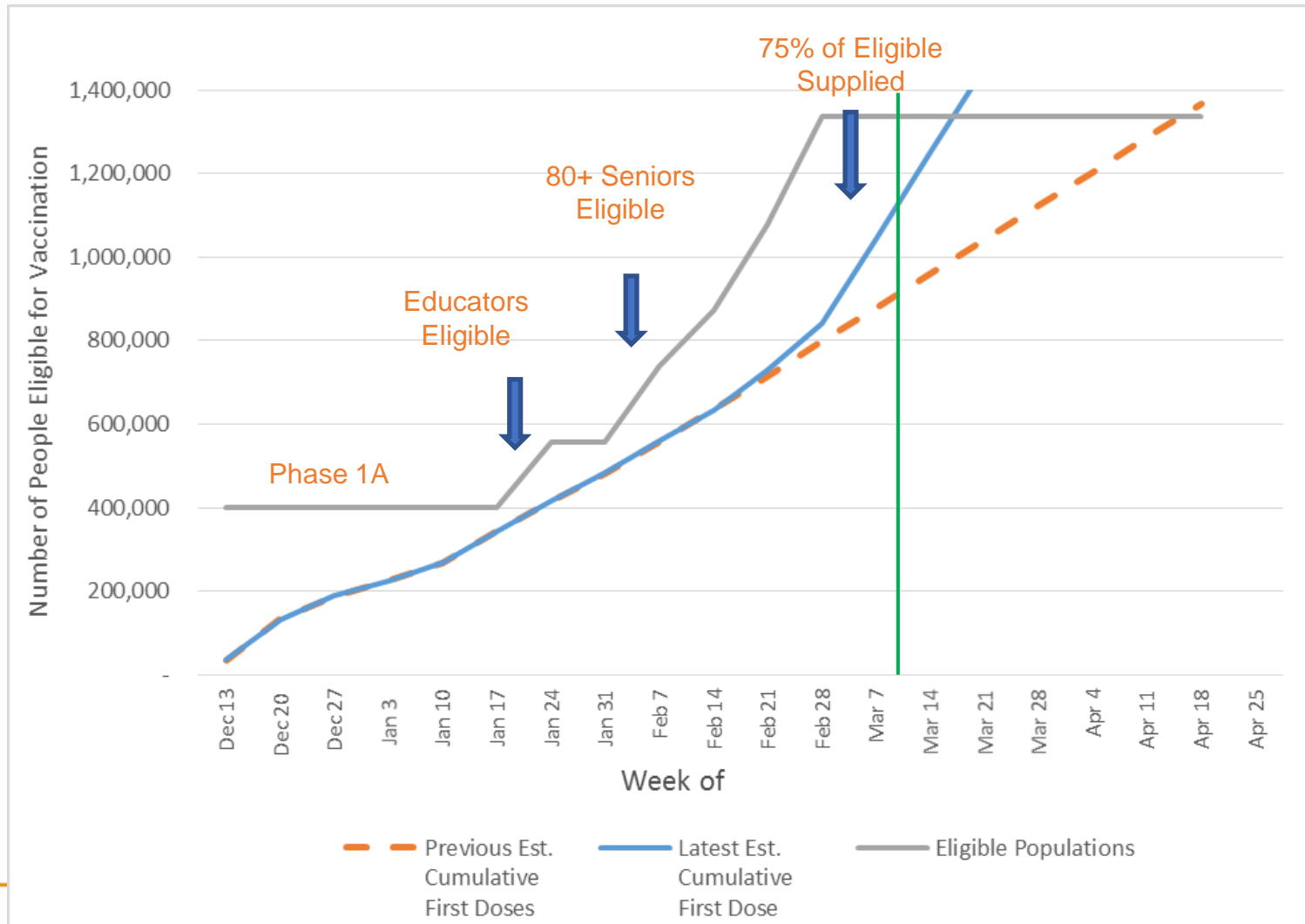

CDC Federal Pharmacy Partnership Program Overview

- Population: long-term care including older adults; adults with physical, developmental and intellectual disabilities; and individuals receiving behavioral health services
- CDC structured the program to roll out in two parts:
 - Part A: All nursing facilities, launched Dec. 21 (130 facilities enrolled)
 - Part B: All other registered facilities, launched Jan. 18 (1,066 facilities enrolled)
 - Assisted living and residential care facilities
 - Adult foster homes for older adults and people with disabilities
 - Behavioral health facilities
 - Continuing Care Retirement Communities
 - HUD Section 202 Supportive Housing for the Elderly
 - Adult group homes for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities
 - State-run Veteran's homes

Vaccination Planning Beyond the CDC Program: Adult Foster Homes

- Work underway to provide vaccine opportunities for smaller care settings not covered by the CDC program,
- APD-licensed adult foster homes with residents: **~1300** (about 6k residents and staff)
 - Received a vaccine opportunity for residents and staff as of March 9th: **768** (about 3,500 residents and staff)
 - Remaining AFHs needing vaccine opportunity: **586** (about 2,700 residents and staff)
 - Sending **558** doses to Josephine and Marion counties this week for AFH
 - Sending **889** doses across 16 counties in following weeks through mid-April for remaining AFH

Vaccination Planning: In-Home Care

- APD In-Home Care caseload: about **25,000** people with high needs
 - Received a vaccine opportunity as of March 9th: **6,647**
 - Remaining needing a vaccine opportunity: **18,353**
 - Sending **2,589** doses to Josephine and Marion counties this week for in-home care
 - Sending about **15,000** doses across 32 counties in following weeks through mid-April for remaining in-home care populations

Recent Expansion of Vaccination Support for Adult Foster Homes and In-Home Care

- On-site vaccine clinics with AMR
- Johnson & Johnson allocation for AFHs
- Dedicated vaccine allocations
- Mobile clinic team
