WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires fee schedule adopted by Parks and Recreation Commission to include a fee differential for non-residents, not to exceed 30 percent of the fee charged to state residents. Takes effect 91st day following adjournment sine die.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Replaces measure. Requires that range of user fees in the schedule adopted by the Parks and Recreation Commission for non-residents must be greater than the range for state residents. Specifies that fee differential for non-residents may not exceed fees charged to residents by more than 30 percent. Takes effect 91st day following adjournment sine die.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon State Parks and Recreation Commission sets rates for the use of park facilities. The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) collects user fees for overnight and day use facilities, and reservations.

Senate Bill 795 would require the fee schedule adopted by the Commission for use of areas established and maintained by OPRD to include a fee differential for non-residents, not to exceed 30 percent of the fee charged to state residents.
