

Wildfire Debris & Hazard Tree Removal Update



Weekly topline points | from the week of March 22-26

- **260** cleared sites completed this week for a total of **889** statewide (out of 2,868 total home sites).
- Hazard tree marking and removal steadily progressing: 57,694 trees marked and 18,401 removed of the more than 290,000 estimated statewide.
- **Fire-impacted corridors continue to be extremely busy** with activity as many different jurisdictions share limited space. We ask everyone to use caution, expect delays, and practice safe driving in these areas.
- We continue to find efficient ways to increase pace and progress. Operational
 examples: on extremely steep slopes, we're using drone technology to identify and
 mark hazard trees, and using on-site metal recycling to save on hauling time and
 capacity.












BY THE NUMBERS

As of Friday 3/26/21

- 1,488 properties and 2,868 home sites participating through complete Right of Entry forms (this number fluctuates).
- Number of crews working continues to increase: 82 contractor crews, 55 monitoring crews currently working.




