WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires the Early Learning Division to conduct study on child care system. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Oregon's child care facility needs
- Requirements of study

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Requires Early Learning Division to conduct assessment of child care facilities. Establishes assessment parameters, reporting requirements, collaboration requirements, and recommendation requirements. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

BACKGROUND:

The Early Learning Division of the Oregon Department of Education was established by passage of House Bill 3234 in 2013. That measure transferred certain duties previously assigned to the Early Learning Council to the Division. Since that time, the Division has served to govern and manage most of the state's early care and education programs and services. House Bill 3201-1 requires the Division to study the state's early learning facilities, including funding streams, and create a report that includes recommendations to the legislature.
