

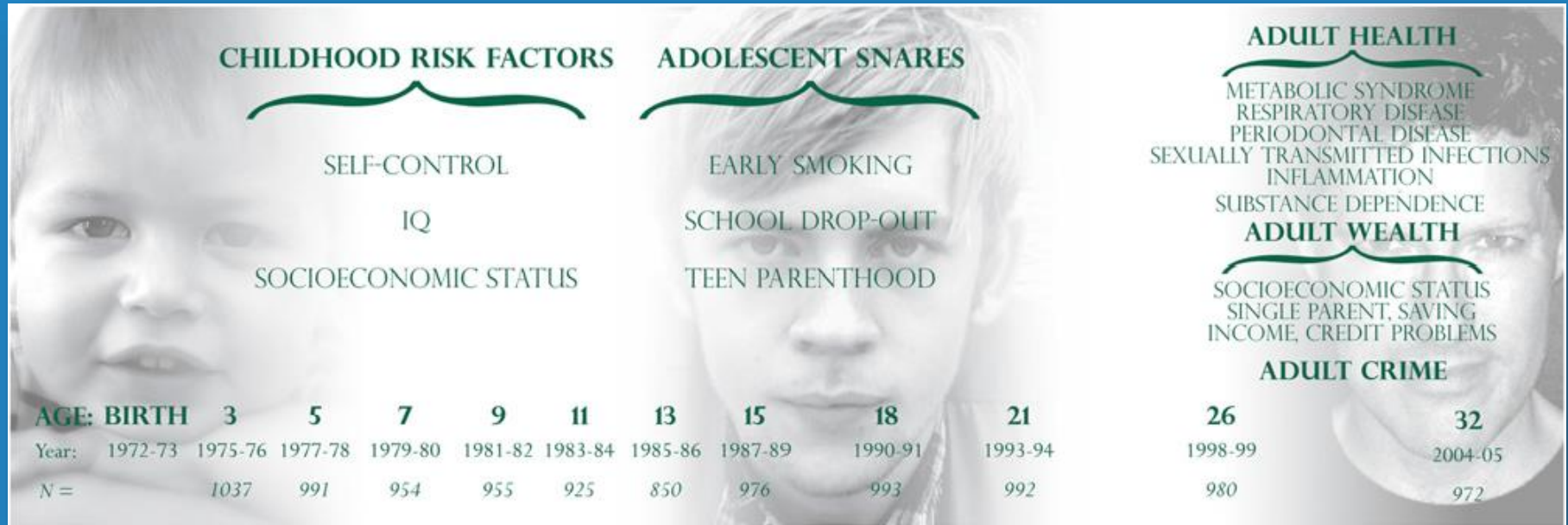

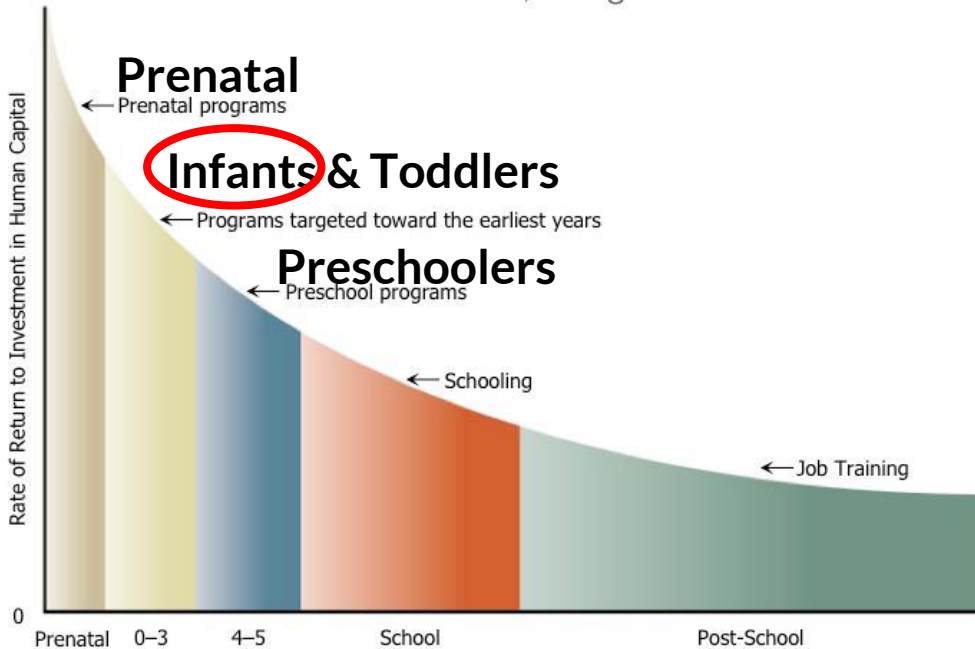
Cradle-to-Prison Pipeline

- Behaviorally

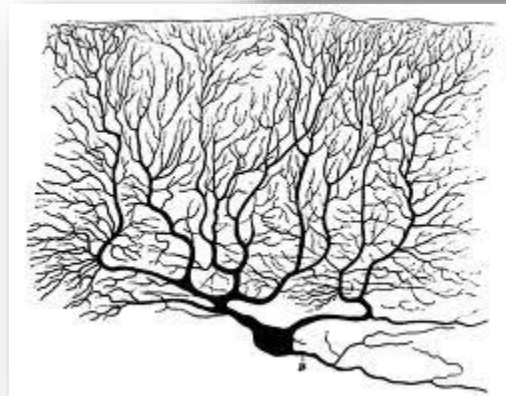
Brain Growth in Infancy

- Most undifferentiated organ in the body
- More than doubles in mass in the first
- Infant brains have neuroplasticity
- Neuroplasticity is both an opportunity & a vulnerability



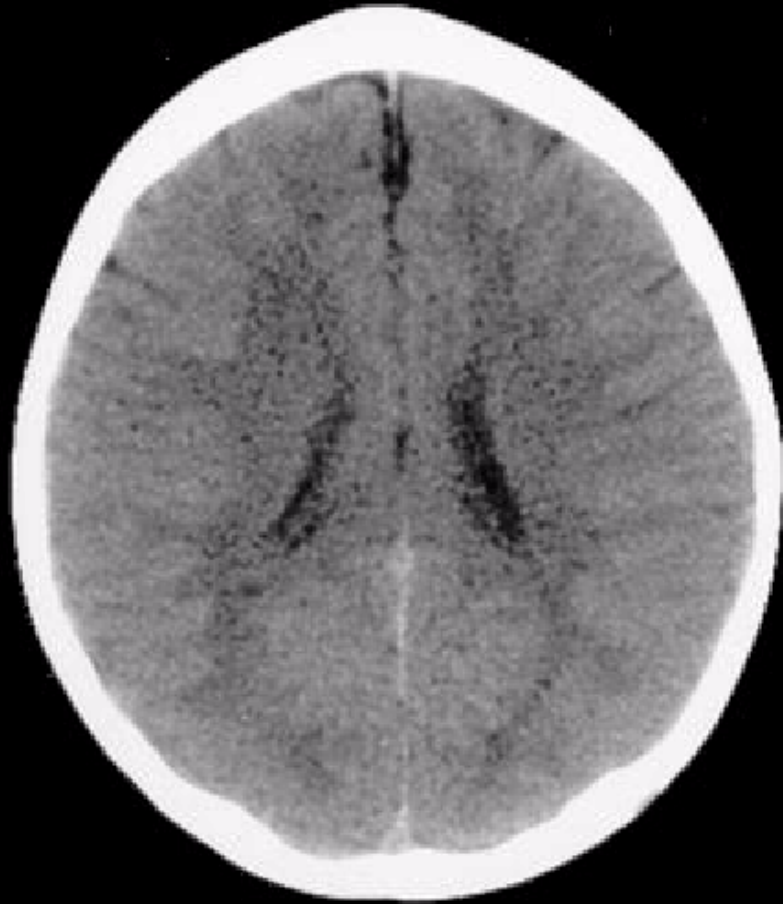
Brain Development

- Neurogenesis
 - 250,000 cells/minute
- Synaptogenesis
 - 40,000 synapses/minute
 - 10,000 synapses/neuron

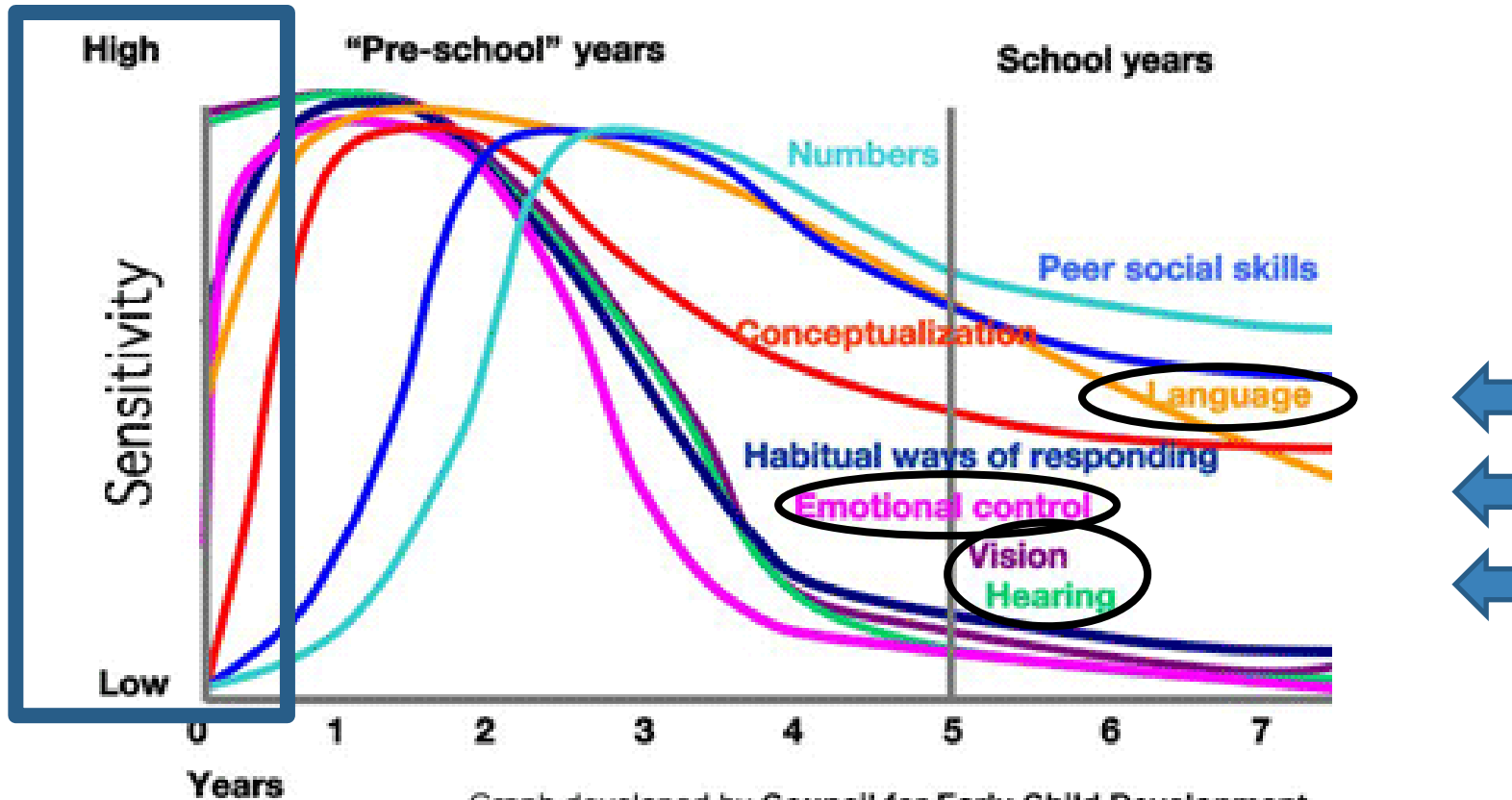

Culture

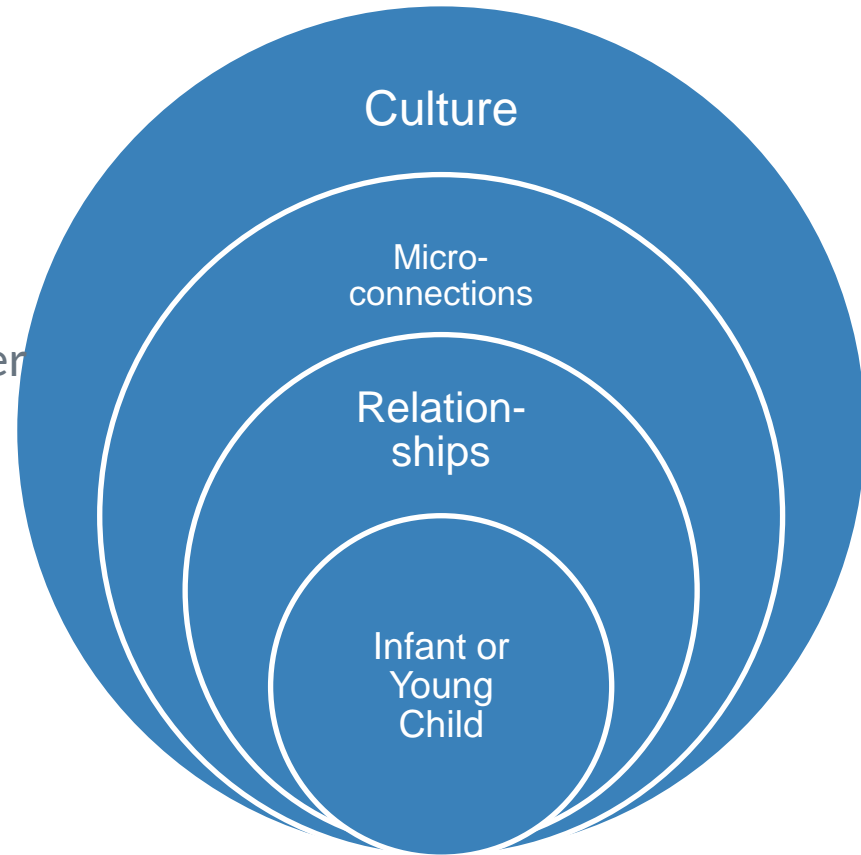



Early Relational Health
