

The **Supporting Tenants Accessing Rental Relief (STARR)** program helps keep households in stable housing situations when facing eviction and other housing emergencies. The program is funded by OHCS and is provided through local Community Action Agencies in your community. Each Community Action Agency has received funding to distribute within their regions of serve. STARR was funded with State General Fund during the December Special Session.



PLEASE NOTE: Spent figures indicate OHCS reimbursement requests and is **not** representative of payments made to landlords. Committed funds are self-reported by Community Action Agencies and can include payments made to landlords or commitments made to tenants or landlords (committed figures from April 15-29). OHCS used remaining Coronavirus Relief Funds to bridge the gap while the Oregon Emergency Rental Assistance Program is designed. An additional \$10 million in STARR rental assistance will be allocated the week of May 3rd. This will ensure rental assistance is available in community ahead of the May 19th when the Oregon Emergency Rental Assistance Program is scheduled for a soft launch.
