#### **Definitions**

 Graduation Requirements: everything a student must do in order to earn a high school diploma

 Statewide Content Standards: documents that define what students should know and be able to do within a content area at specific grade levels

Curriculum: the lesson plans and materials used in the classroom to instruct students

- Graduation Requirements
  - ORS 329.451
    - 24 total credits
    - 3 Mathematics credits
    - 4 English language arts credits (may be changed by HB 2056)
    - Gives authority to State Board to enact additional requirements
      - OAR 581-022-2000 (6)
        - Course Work
          - Social studies (3) —
          - Science (3)
          - Health (1)
          - Physical education (1)
          - Career and Technical Education,
             The Arts or World Languages (3)

"Including history, civics, geography and economics (including personal finance)"



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          - Social studies (3)
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          - Health (1)
          - Physical education (1)

SB 513: Adds .5 credit of Civics to statutory graduation requirements

SB 744: Requires review of all graduation requirements



- Graduation Requirements
  - ORS 329.451
    - Gives authority to State Board to enact additional requirements
      - OAR 581-022-2000 (6)
        - Non-coursework requirements:
          - Essential Skills
          - Education plan/profile
          - Collection of evidence to demonstrate the application and extension of knowledge and skills
          - Career-related learning experiences
    - Gives authority to local school boards to enact additional requirements
    - Variations in requirements for modified and extended diplomas

SB 744:
Requires review of all graduation requirements;
Suspends essential skills for two years, then eliminates them pending review



- Content Standards
  - Generally the purview of the State Board of Education (ORS 326.051)
  - Legislature can direct the State Board to:
    - Create new content standards on a specific topic
    - Include specific topics in existing content standards
    - Consult specific stakeholder groups in reviewing content standards

SB 702: Requires
State Board to
review social
studies standards

#### Curriculum

- Legislature generally plays no role
  - State Board approves (ORS 326.051)
  - Local boards select (ORS 332.075 (1)(b))
