Pesticide Regulation



ORS Chapter 634

Foundational statute for Oregon's pesticide program that governs ODA's enforcement and education authorities

EPA & ODA Cooperative Agreement

Legal agreement that outlines the delegate authorities from EPA to ODA

EPA & FIFRA

Foundational federal law and authority that governs all pesticide use, manufacturing, and sales in all 50 states



State and Federal Responsibilities



Oregon Department of Agriculture

- Register pesticides for sale in Oregon
- Investigate and enforce pesticide requirements
- License applicators
- Establish and implement certification and training programs
- Collaborate with state and federal partners for pesticide stewardship
- Regulate pesticides within authorities
- Provide for special local needs & emergency situations

Environmental Protection Agency

- Register pesticides for use in U.S.
- Evaluate new pesticides & uses
- Review safety of all pesticides
- Register pesticide producing establishments
- Develop & enforce pesticide requirements




Oregon Pesticide Regulation





In 2015 ODA adopted final rules banning 4 active ingredients from being applied to linden trees





Chlorpyrifos

In 2020 ODA restricted the use of the active ingredient chlorpyrifos in Oregon

The second secon	root weevil spruce spider mite	3.9 to 6.4 fl. oz. per acre (0.06 to 0.1 lb. ai per acre)	 For spray applications, cover foliage with sufficient water to provide thorough, uniform coverage and distribution of spray mixture. For ground applications, use a minimum of 20 gallons of spray mixture per acre. For air applications, use a minimum of 5 gallons of spray mixture per acre. This product is normally not phytotoxic to Christmas trees. Since all varieties grown under local climatic conditions may be hardy to this product, test a small area of typical plants to ensure that no injury occurs. Do not apply more than 0.1 lb. a.i. (6.4 fl. oz. formulated product) per acre per year. Do not make more than 3 applications per year. Do not make applications less than 21 days apart. Do not make applications through irrigation systems. For use only in OR & WA.



Pesticide Investigation Process



PARC, 211, citizen, industry, government agency

Collect physical evidence, interviews, record inspections

Lab results, records data, photos, timelines, prior incidents

Authority to issues administrative volitions, civil penalties, revoke license
