

### **FIFRA/FFDCA Statutory Scheme**


Multiple interconnected programs in recognition that no single, independent action or stakeholder can ensure adequate protection.



## The FQPA requires:

- "A reasonable certainty of **no harm**"
- Periodic re-evaluation to include new science
- Consideration of:
  - The susceptibility of children through use of additional tenfold (10X) safety factor
  - Aggregate risk from exposure from multiple sources (food, water, residential, occupational)
  - **Cumulative exposure** to pesticides that have common mechanisms of toxicity

### Organophosphate incidents reported to NPIC before and after FQPA




#### Figure 2
