# **PSYCHIATRIC SECURITY REVIEW BOARD**

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Psychiatric Security Review Board subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

### **Appointees**

Anne Nichol of Portland; Reappointment Scott Reichlin of Salem; Reappointment Stewart Newman of Hillsboro; New Appointment

#### Term

Nichol: July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2025 Reichlin: July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2025 Newman: July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2025

### **Appointment/Confirmation Authority**

ORS 161.385 (2019)

### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

Not required.

### **Statutory Requirements**<sup>3</sup>

The board consists of ten members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate.<sup>4</sup> The membership of the board may not include any district attorney, deputy district attorney, or public defender. Membership must include:

- a psychiatrist experienced in the criminal justice system and not otherwise employed on a full-time basis by the Oregon Health Authority or a community mental health program (REICHLIN);
- a licensed psychologist experienced in the criminal justice system and not otherwise employed on a full-time basis by the authority or a community mental health program (BUCHANAN);

- a member with substantial experience in the processes of parole and probation (LE PARC);
- a lawyer with substantial experience in criminal trial practice (NICHOL);
- a psychiatrist certified, or eligible to be certified, by the Oregon Medical Board in child psychiatry who is experienced in the juvenile justice system and not employed on a fulltime basis by the authority or a community mental health program (KUENZI);
- a licensed psychologist who is experienced in child psychology and the juvenile justice system and not employed on a full-time basis by the authority or a community mental health program (MILLER);
- a member with substantial experience in the processes of juvenile parole and probation;
- a lawyer with substantial experience in juvenile law practice; and
- two members of the general public (**NEWMAN**, SWETNAM).

Members serve four-year terms, are eligible for reappointment, and may be removed by the Governor for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office. The board consists of a five-member adult panel and a five-member juvenile panel. Each panel must select one of its members as chairperson to serve for a one-year term with such duties and powers as the panel determines. A majority of the voting members of a panel constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. Each panel must meet at least twice every month, unless the chairperson determines that there is not sufficient business before the panel to warrant a meeting at the scheduled time. The panel also meets at other times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the panel.

## **Duties and Authority**

A criminal defendant who is found guilty except for insanity may be placed under the jurisdiction of the board.<sup>5</sup> The board protects the public by working with partnering agencies to ensure persons under its jurisdiction receive the necessary services and support to reduce the risk of future dangerous behavior using recognized principles of risk assessment, victims' interests and person centered care.<sup>6</sup>

The board must:7

- adjudicate the discharge, conditional release, or commitment modification of individuals placed in its jurisdiction;
- provide notice of hearings and orders, conditional release, discharge, or escape to specified parties and afford those parties an opportunity to be heard, either orally or in writing at a hearing;
- maintain and keep current the medical, social, and criminal history of all persons committed to its jurisdiction; and
- consult with the Oregon Health Authority on the certification of psychiatrists and licensed psychologists for the evaluation of a defendant on the issue of insanity.

The board may:<sup>8</sup>

- implement its policies and set out its procedure and practice requirements and may promulgate such interpretive rules as the board deems necessary or appropriate to carry out its statutory responsibilities;
- issue subpoenas requiring the attendance and testimony of witnesses or the production of evidence;
- develop a restorative justice program to assist the recovery of crime victims; and
- adopt rules for the administration of statutory provisions.
