WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD

The Governor has appointed the following individual to the Workers' Compensation Board subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Appointees

Statement of Economic Interest²

Required.

Statutory Requirements³

The board consists of five members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate.⁴ Not more than three members may belong to one political party and must be appointed to fairly represent the interests of all concerned. All board members must impartially apply the law in each case and may not represent any special interest. At least two members must be selected from among persons with background and understanding as to the concerns of employers (CUREY (D), WOODFORD) and at least two members of the board must be selected from among persons with background and understanding as to the concerns of employees (**CEJA**, OUSEY (D)). One member must represent the interests of the public and serve as the board chairperson (WOLD (D)).

No member may hold any other office or position of profit or pursue any other business or vocation or serve on or under any committee of any political party.⁵ Before entering on the duties of office, each member must take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation and execute a bond payable to the state and conditioned on the faithful discharge of the duties of the office.

Members serve four-year terms from the date of appointment and qualification. Each member holds office until a successor is appointed and qualified. The Governor may at any time remove a member for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office after providing a copy of the charges and an opportunity for a hearing.⁶ A majority of the board's members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.⁷ No vacancy may impair the right of the remaining members to exercise all the powers of the board.

Duties and Authority

The board provides timely and impartial resolution of disputes arising under Oregon Workers' Compensation Law and the Oregon Safe Employment Act.⁸ The chairperson supervises and manages the board and the Hearings Division, in which administrative law judges (ALJs) conduct contested case hearings and provide alternative dispute resolution.⁹

The board must:10

- review and approve or deny claim disposition agreements;
- adopt rules and standards for the administration of specified statutory duties;
- receive requests for hearings and refer to an ALJ for determination;
- receive and adjudicate appealed orders of ALJs; and
- consult with the chairperson on the administration of the Hearings Division.

The board may:¹¹

- exercise own motion jurisdiction of all claims within the board's authority;
- impose sanctions for an appeal or motion which the board finds is frivolous or filed in bad faith;
- hold sessions at any place within the state;
- administer oaths;
- issue and serve by the board's representatives, or by any sheriff, subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and the production of papers, contracts, books, accounts, documents and testimony;
- generally provide for the taking of testimony and for the recording of proceedings; and
- make and declare all rules which are reasonably required in the performance of its duties.
