#### Weekly topline points | from the week of May 17-21

- We have passed the halfway point for participating home sites cleared. +63 cleared sites completed this week for a total of 1,879 statewide (out of 2,825 total home sites).
- **78,944 fire-damaged trees marked and 36,815 removed** of the more than 140,000 estimated statewide. Trees are marked through a series of reviews and quality control measures.
- **Review of hazard tree operation underway. Independent arborist began work this week.** Findings report expected in early June and we look forward to learning more about any potential recommendations.
- Working closely with a range of federal and state partners to prepare and be ready for fire season. Ongoing planning and coordination with USFS, BLM, ODF and local jurisdictions to ensure our operation is ready for any challenges resulting from another potentially severe wildfire season.
- With Memorial Day approaching, we encourage travelers to use alternate routes and avoid delays. This is especially true for the Highway 138 east of Roseburg/Glide where BLM recreation sites and boat ramps have reopened.
