## Oregon's Most Vulnerable Students Need Immediate Help To Become Readers

Dedicating COVID relief or other funds to immediately offer expert, proven training to all K-5 teachers and reading specialists at our lowest performing schools will transform students' lives

Oregon had a reading crisis before COVID: over <u>HALF of our 3rd graders</u> weren't reading at grade level. Over 66% of economically disadvantaged, 70% of American Indian/Alaska Native, 71% of Latinx, 73% of Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, and 74% of our Black 3rd graders weren't reading at grade level. <u>Studies show that without intervention, students who struggle with reading rarely catch up.</u> A first grader with poor reading skills has a 90% chance of continuing to be a poor reader.

Distance learning during COVID has only made the crisis worse, especially for Black, Indigenous and other students of color.

#### A Systemic Crisis Needs A Systemic Solution

Science proves that almost any child can learn to read, given the right type of <u>instruction</u>. Unfortunately, Oregon students are unlikely to receive this instruction because <u>most of Oregon's colleges and universities do not offer our teachers the type of literacy training</u> that's grounded in how the brain works when it comes to reading.

There is a better way: districts and states that have trained their teachers in a clear, explicit instruction program called Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (<u>LETRS</u>) have seen dramatic student improvement. In <u>Bethlehem</u>, <u>PA</u>, after only three years, they've gone from 56% to 84% of their students reading at grade level. <u>Mississippi</u>, which trained over 15,000 teachers in LETRS, was the only state in the country whose 4th grade reading scores <u>improved</u> - in contrast to Oregon's scores which have been <u>flat</u> and below the national average.

Recognizing the need to immediately address their district's literacy crisis, <u>Portland Public Schools have begun training its</u> <u>teachers in LETRS</u>, a commitment that will transform PPS students' opportunities for becoming strong readers. Every Oregon student deserves the same.

#### Oregon's Lowest Performing Schools Are Located All Across The State

Oregon's CSI and TSI\*\* schools span our urban, rural and coastal communities and include students of all races and economic backgrounds. By focusing first on these schools, we will immediately reach our most struggling students.

The cost of training about 2,900 teachers at CSI and TSI schools is approximately \$20 million. The economic cost of *not* training teachers is billions of dollars in <u>later interventions</u>, lower high school graduation rates, higher incarceration rates, and <u>fewer taxpayers earning a living wage</u>. The human cost of Oregon children never attaining foundational literacy is incalculable.
