Statewide Need for Fair Housing Enforcement

In a survey of 600 rural Oregonians:

- 39% of residents overall in rural areas would "do nothing" if faced with housing discrimination
- 53% of nonwhite residents in rural areas would "do nothing" if faced with housing discrimination
- only one said that they would contact a fair housing organization, and none said that they would contact HUD or BOLI if discriminated against

Fair Housing Investment Objectives

- Create a collaborative partnership between Fair Housing Council of Oregon (FHCO), Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI), and Department of Justice (DOJ) and other housing community partners.
- **Partner with culturally-specific organizations**, and other local, and community partners to increase underreporting of discrimination.
- Build on existing model of **collaborative housing enforcement**.
- Provide for scalability of investment.
