# Wildfire Debris & Hazard Tree Removal Update

#### Weekly topline points | from the week of May 24-28

- We have passed the halfway point for participating home sites cleared. +87 cleared sites completed this week for a total of 1,966 statewide (out of 2,831 total home sites).
- **80,604 fire-damaged trees marked and 39,098 removed** of the more than 140,000 estimated statewide. Trees are marked through a series of reviews and quality control measures.
- **Review of hazard tree operation underway by an Independent arborist.** Field work completed with final report expected in early June and we look forward to learning more about any potential recommendations.
- **Know before you go this Memorial Day.** Along with TripCheck, add Oregon's <u>recreation</u> <u>site status map</u> to your resource list. It's a must-check, one-stop shop for anyone exploring the outdoors this summer.
- **The deadline to apply for property cleanup is approaching.** We want to give everyone with wildfire damaged properties the opportunity to participate in the state-led cleanup program.
